RESOLUTION No. XVII.

Whereas the appointment to the Executive Council of Elected Members of the Legislative Council under the British Guiana (Constitution) Order in Council, 1928, was for the purpose of securing an expression of the viewpoint of the Electives as a whole; and

Whereas the Oath of Secrecy exacted from Members of the Executive Council was designed to meet other conditions and precludes the Elected Members from consulting their colleagues when the occasion arises:

Be it Resolved,—That the Officer Administering the Government be respectfully requested to consider that when matters are involved which will require a money vote or subsequent legislation in the Legislative Council the obligation imposed by the Oath of Secrecy may with the advice of the Executive Council be waived.
