FIRST LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

SECOND SESSION

RESOLUTION No. XXXVIII.

That this Council learns with profound regret of the continued and lamentable illness of Sir Gordon Guggisberg, and his consequent enforced retirement from the Governorship of the Colony on the threshold of his term of office, and desires that there should be recorded on its Minutes, and conveyed to His Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies for transmission to Sir Gordon, its exceedingly high appreciation of his zealous attention to detail, his self-sacrificing devotion to duty, his keen insight into the problems of the Colony, and his determined efforts during so short a period of his sojourn in the Colony, to find a solution for those problems which have baffled so many successive administrators.

The Council also wishes to express its sincere hope that, in due course, Sir Gordon Guggisberg may be restored to the fulness of his health, and that there be conveyed to him its deep sympathy in the days of his present illness, and the assurance that all ranks and classes of the community will watch for his speedy restoration to health.

The Council also desires to place on record its profound gratitude for the magnificent lead and example which he set to all Colonists in optimism, courage and resourcefulness, during his brief administration of the Government of the Colony.
