FIRST LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

SECOND SESSION.

RESOLUTION No. XXIX.

WHEREAS it is evident that the expenditure of the Colony for the ensuing year will exceed the Revenue ;

AND WHEREAS the embarrassment created by the state of the Colony's finance makes it imperative for Government to forthwith adopt some relief as well as reproductive measures with the view of restoring prosperity to this Country :

Be it Resolved,—That the Officer Administering the Government be respectfully requested to appoint a Committee of this Council and other suitable persons resident in this Colony to enquire into and report upon :—

- (a) The inauguration of an Agricultural Aid Bank, and best way of financing the same.
- (b) The bridging of the Demerara River.
- (c) Railway extension to the Mazaruni District.

Passed by the Legislative Council this 23rd day of January, 1930.
