BRITISH GUIANA.

ORDINANCE NO. 13 OF 1934.

AN ORDINANCE further to amend the Petroleum Ordinance, 1930.

A.D. 1934.

BE it enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Petroleum Ordinance, 1934, and shall be construed with the Petroleum Ordinance, 1930, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any amending Ordinance. Short Title.

2. Section two of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by— Amdt. to sec.
2 of Ord. 7 of
1930.

Ordinary Petroleum defined.

(a) substituting the following as the definition of "Ordinary Petroleum" :—

"Ordinary Petroleum" means petroleum other than dangerous petroleum, and having a flash point which is not above one hundred and fifty degrees Fahrenheit ;

(b) adding the following at the end of the section :—

"Nothing in this Ordinance shall apply to petroleum which has a flash point above one hundred and fifty degrees Fahrenheit when tested in the manner prescribed in section thirteen hereof."

Ordinance not to apply to petroleum with flash point above 150°

3. Sub-section (1) of section five of the Principal Ordinance, as enacted by section four of the Petroleum Ordinance, 1932, is hereby amended by the addition of the following :—

Quantity of methylated spirits to be kept by chemists and druggists.

"provided further that methylated spirits in quantity not exceeding four gallons may be kept by a registered chemist and druggist."

4. Sub-section (1) of section twenty-six of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following :—

"(f) generally as to the keeping and use of petroleum to which this Ordinance applies."


Repeal and re-enactment of sec. 27 of Ord. of 1930.

5. Section twenty-seven of the Principal Ordinance, section fourteen of the Petroleum Ordinance, 1932, and section four of the Petroleum Ordinance (No. 2), 1932, are repealed and the following is substituted for section twenty-seven of the Principal Ordinance :—

Saving as to methylated spirits in a spirit warehouse or distiller's spirit store. Cap. 110.

"27. Nothing in this Ordinance shall apply to methylated spirits stored in a spirit warehouse or a distiller's spirit store under the Spirits Ordinance."
