

ORDINANCE No. 4 OF 1913.

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Spirits Ordinance, 1905. A.D. 1913.

[1st April, 1913.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Court of Policy thereof, as follows:—

1. In section thirty-nine of the Spirits Ordinance, 1905, the words "one and a half" shall be inserted in the sixth line of sub-section (3) thereof in lieu of the word "two"; and the following proviso shall be added at the end of the said sub-section:

"Provided that the allowance may be increased up to two per cent. by the Chief Commissary if it is proved to his satisfaction that the additional loss was unavoidable and that none of the spirit has entered into local consumption."

2. In section forty-four sub-section 1 of the said Ordinance there shall be substituted for the bracketed words "by weight" the bracketed words "by weight or gauge."

3. This Ordinance may be cited as the Spirits Ordinance, 1905, Amendment Ordinance, 1913, and shall be read as one with the Spirits Ordinance, 1905, Amendment Ordinance, 1911.
