AN ORDINANCE to amend the Licensed Places (Hours of Closing) Ordinance, 1902.

[22nd May, 1907.]

Short title and construction.

BE it enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Court of Policy thereof, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Licensed Places (Hours of Closing) Ordinance, 1902, Amendment Ordinance, 1907, and this

Ordinance and the Licensed Places (Hours of Closing) Ordinance, 1902, shall be read and construed together as one Ordinance.

2.—(1) Any person who is found in any licensed place within any period during which business cannot therein be lawfully transacted, or during which such place is by law required to be closed or forbidden to be opened, shall, unless he satisfies the Magistrate that he was in such place as an inmate, servant, or lodger or otherwise lawfully, be guilty of an offence, and, being convicted thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding ten dollars.

Penalty on persons found in licensed places during closing hours.

- (2) Any police constable may demand the name and address of any person found in any licensed place within any such period, and, if such name or such address is not given or if there is reasonable ground for suspecting the name and address given to be false, may arrest such person without a warrant, unless such person produces satisfactory proof as to the correctness of the name and address given, and carry him as soon as practicable before a Magistrate.
- (3) Any person who fails, when so required by a police constable, to give his name and address, or gives a false name or address, or produces false testimony in respect of his name or address shall be guilty of an offence, and, being convicted thereof, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty-four dollars.
