A BILL

Intituled

An Act to make provision for certain matters touching on national security.

A. D. 1973 Enacted by the Parliament of Guyana:—

Short Title 1. This Act may be cited as the National Security (Miscellaneous Provisions) (Modification) Act 1973.

Re-enactment of certain provisions No. 7 of 1966. 2. The provisions contained in Part II of the National Security (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1966 at the time of its enactment are hereby re-enacted as Part II of the Act and the proviso enacted at the said time to section 1(2) of the Act shall have effect accordingly.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

Part II of the National Security (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1966 contained certain provisions relating to preventive detention and restriction of movement. These provisions were to expire eighteen months after their enactment but could be continued in force on a periodical basis by resolutions of the National Assembly. Pursuant to this procedure the provisions were allowed to expire in June 1971. This Bill now seeks to re-enact the provisions.
