AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE FIRE PREVENTION ORDIN-ANCE, 1954.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana: -

This Ordinance may be cited as the Fire Prevention (Amend- Short Title. ment) Ordinance, 1959, and shall be construed and read with the Fire Prevention Ordinance, 1954, hereinafter referred to as the Principal No. 19 of 1954. Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the Amendment of section of section of Ordinance of the definition of the expression "inspector" and by the substitution therefor of the following definition -

""inspector" means any member of the British Guiana Fire Brigade authorised in writing by the Chief Fire Officer thereof to inspect premises under this Ordinance or any regulations made thereunder;"

3. Section 5 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the Amendment of section deletion of the words "authorised in writing by the Superintendent". of Ordinar No. 19 of No. 19 of Ordinar No. 19 of Ordina

OBJECTS AND REASONS

Section 2 of the Fire Prevention Ordinance, 1954, defines the expression "inspector" for the purposes of the Ordinance as a sub-officer within the meaning of the Constabulary Ordinance. Having regard to the repeal of the latter Ordinance and the establishment of the British Guiana Fire Brigade as a separate entity from the Police Force by the Fire Brigade Ordinance, 1957, Clause 2 of this Bill seeks to amend section 2 of The Fire Prevention Ordinance, 1954, to re-define the expression "inspector" to mean any member of the Brigade authorised in writing by the Chief Fire Officer to inspect premises under that Ordinance or regulations made thereunder.

2. Clause 3 of the Bill seeks to effect a consequential amendment to section 5 of the Ordinance in view of the proposed new definition of the word "inspector".
