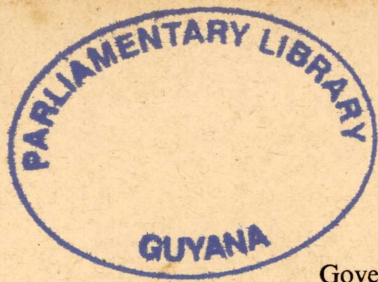

AN ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE THE SUPPLIES GRANTED IN THE CURRENT SESSION OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL.

WHEREAS of the amount of fifty million, four hundred and fifty-seven thousand, four hundred and eighteen dollars required for the service of the Civil Government of British Guiana, and for other purposes, for the year commencing the first day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty, the sum of five million, three hundred and fifty-eight thousand, one hundred and sixty-six dollars has been provided for by law, and it is now requisite to make provision for the appropriation from the annual revenue of the year and other resources of British Guiana of forty-five million, ninety-nine thousand, two hundred and fifty-two dollars:

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Appropriation (1960) Ordinance, 1959. Short title.
2. The Accountant General shall, on the warrant of the Governor, pay from the annual revenue of the year, commencing on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and sixty, and other resources of British Guiana a sum not exceeding in the aggregate forty-five million, ninety-nine thousand two hundred and fifty-two dollars as set forth in the schedule hereto for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Civil Government of British Guiana, and for other purposes during the said year. Accountant General to defray expenses of Civil Government.
