AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE GEORGETOWN TOWN COUNCIL ORDINANCE.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana :—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Georgetown Town Council (Amendment) Ordinance, 1960, and shall be construed and read with the Georgetown Town Council Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same. Cap. 152.

2. Section 138 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion after the words— Amendment of section 138 of Chapter 152.

“four plots or pieces of Crown lands under the control of the Council situate, lying, and being to the west of the public buildings and the Demerara ice house, and between Hadfield Street on the south and Croal Street on the north;”

of the words —

“every shed constructed as a shelter for the use of persons waiting to join motor buses, furnished with seating accommodation for such persons and situated at a stopping place for motor buses indicated by a traffic sign prescribed by law for indicating such places, so long as the shed is furnished and situated as aforesaid;”

OBJECTS AND REASONS

Section 138 of the Georgetown Town Council Ordinance provides for the exemption of certain lands, buildings and erections from town taxes levied and raised by the Georgetown Town Council. It is proposed to erect shelters at bus stops for persons waiting to join buses.

2. This Bill seeks to extend such exemption to shelters so erected.
