## A BILL

## AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE VOLUNTEER ORDINANCE.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Volunteer (Amendment) Ordinance, 1960, and shall be construed and read with the Volunteer Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance and any Ordinance amending the same.

Short title.

Cap. 88.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the repeal of the definition of the expression "Army Act" and the substitution therefor of the following definition —

Amendment of section 2 of Chapter 88.

3 & 4 Eliz. 2 c. 18 "Army Act" means the Army Act, 1955, and includes any Act amending or replacing the same;

3. Subsection (2) of section 26 of the Principal Ordinance as amended by the Volunteer (Amendment) Ordinance, 1957, is hereby amended by the substitution for the figures "39" of the figures "192".

Amendment of section 26 of Chapter 88. No. 2 of 1957.

4. Subsection (6) of section 29 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the substitution for the word "court" of the word "board".

Amendment of section 29 of Chapter 88.

5. The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion after section 34 of the following section —

Insertion of section 35 in Chapter 88.

"Establishment of Cadet Corps. 35.(1) The Governor may by order establish Cadet Corps affiliated to the Force, and may by regulations prescribe, in respect of any such Corps —

- (a) the nature and incidence of its affiliation to the Force;
- (b) its description and the manner in which it shall be organised and administered;
- (c) the numbers and conditions of enrolment therein.

(2) Enrolment in any Cadet Corps established under this section shall be voluntary, and, subject to the provisions of any regulations made by the Governor in pursuance of this section, a Cadet Corps shall not form part of the Force for the purpose of any provisions of this Ordinance."

## OBJECTS AND REASONS

Clause 2 of the Bill seeks to redefine the expression "Army Act" in the Volunteer Ordinance, Chapter 88, as a result of the enactment of the Army Act, 1955, and clauses 3 and 4 seek to provide for consequential amendments to the Ordinance.

2. It is considered desirable that there should be a legal basis for the establishment of Cadet Corps and clause 5 seeks to make provision for this.
