An Ordinance to amend the Liquor Licensing Ordinance.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

- This Ordinance may be cited as the Liquor Licensing (Amend- short title. ment) Ordinance, 1964, and shall be construed and read with the Liquor Licensing Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, Cap. 316. and any Ordinance amending the same.
- 2. The Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion Insertion of section 19 amended by the insertion of section 19 in Principal Ordinance.

- "Alteration of 19A. (1) Where the Comptroller has issued a licence refund of fee under section 19 of this Ordinance in respect of premises which have been altered, damaged or destroyed subsequent to the grant of the licence so that such premises no longer comply with the provisions of this Ordinance, the licence in respect of such premises shall be deemed to have been cancelled-
  - (a) in the case of an alteration, from the date of the commencement of such alteration; and
  - (b) in the case of damage or destruction, from the date of such damage or destruction.
  - (2) The licensee of such premises shall forthwith inform the Comptroller in writing of the fact of such alteration, damage or destruction and the Comptroller, may, as he thinks fit, refund the whole or any part of the licence duty paid by the licensee."

## **OBJECTS AND REASONS**

Where premises which have been licensed under the Intoxicating Liquor Licensing Ordinance are altered either by design or accident there is no provision for cancelling the licence nor for the refund of any of the licence fee.

2. This Bill seeks to make provision for the cancellation of such licences and gives a discretion to the Comptroller of Customs and Excise to refund the whole or any part of the licence fee as he thinks fit.
