WIDOWS AND ORPHANS PENSION (AMENDMENT NO. 2)
BILL, 1964.

A BILL

Intituled

An Ordinance to amend the Widows and Orphans Pension Ordinance.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

A.D. 1964

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Widows and Orphans Pension (Amendment No. 2) Ordinance, 1964, and shall be construed and read as one with the Widows and Orphans Pension Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

Short title.

Cap. 75

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the substitution for the definition of the expression "approved scheme" appearing therein of the following definition —

Amendment of section 2 of Chapter 75.

“approved scheme” means a scheme for the granting of pensions to the Widows and children of government officers established in any other British possession or in the United Kingdom whether such British possession is independent or not, and approved by the Governor;’

3. Table B in the schedule to the Principal Ordinance as inserted by the Widows and Orphans (Amendment) Ordinance, 1958, is hereby amended by the deletion from the headings thereof of —

Amendment of schedule to Chapter 75. No. 7 of 1958.

- (a) the words “or after” after the words “terminating on”;
- (b) the words and number “and before the attainment of age 61” after the number “60”.

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The purpose of this Bill is to extend the definition of the expression “approved scheme” under the Widows and Orphans Pension Ordinance, Chapter 75, to include schemes established in any other part of the Commonwealth.

2. The Bill also seeks to amend Table B in the schedule to that Ordinance to make it clear that the Table relates to contributions terminating on the attainment of the age of sixty years.
