CUSTOMS (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1964.

Arrangement of Sections.

1. Short title.
2. Amendment of section 138 of Chapter 309.

A BILL

Intituled

An Ordinance to amend the Customs Ordinance.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

A.D. 1964.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Customs (Amendment) Ordinance, 1964, and shall be construed and read with the Customs Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

Short title.
Cap. 309.

2. Section 138 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the substitution of a colon for the full stop at the end of the section and by the addition thereto of the following proviso —

“Provided that the Comptroller may, on such conditions as he may think fit, permit the exportation of any such goods, other than goods declared under the provisions of section 96 of this Ordinance to be goods which shall or may be warehoused upon first importation without payment of duty thereon, in any ship of less burden than thirty-five tons.”

OBJECTS AND REASONS

Under section 138 of the Customs Ordinance, Chapter 309, it is unlawful to export certain goods in any ship of less burden than thirty-five tons.

2. The purpose of this Bill is to empower the Comptroller of Customs to permit, on conditions that he may impose, the exportation of such goods in any ship of less burden than thirty-five tons.
