### A BILL Intituled

An Ordinance to amend the Mariners' Club (Georgetown) Ordinance.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

A.D. 1963.

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Mariners' Club (George-Short title. town (Amendment) Ordinance, 1963, and shall be construed and read with the Mariners' Club (Georgetown) Ordinance, hereinafter referred Cap. 202. to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.
- 2. Subsection (1) of section 4 of the Principal Ordinance is Amendment hereby amended by the substitution for the word "two" of the word of section 4 of Chapter 202.
- 3. Where before the commencement of this Ordinance any Validation person who was appointed a trustee of the Mariners' Club purported trustees. Validation of acts of trustees. fully done by him as a trustee notwithstanding that his term of office had expired before such act was done.

#### OBJECTS AND REASONS

This Bill seeks to increase the number of trustees of the Mariners' Club (Georgetown) from six to seven, with a view to including a member of a seaman's union among the number of trustees.

Clause 3 of the Bill seeks to validate acts of the trustees, performed when their terms of office had expired.
