FIRE PREVENTION (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1963.

Intituled

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Fire Prevention Ordinance, 1954.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

A.D. 1963.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Fire Prevention (Amendment) Ordinance, 1963, and shall be construed and read with the Fire Prevention Ordinance, 1954, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance, and any Ordinance amending the same.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the substitution for the definition of the expression "the Superintendent" of the following definition —

“the Superintendent” means the Chief Fire Officer of the British Guiana Fire Brigade established under the Fire Brigade Ordinance, 1957, and any member of that Brigade not below the rank of sub-officer.’
