INTITULED

AN ORDINANCE TO MAKE SPECIAL PROVISION IN REGARD TO THE PENSION AND GRATUITY PAYABLE TO VIVIAN CHARLES DIAS.

Enacted by the Legislature of British Guiana:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Dias Pension Ordinance, 1957.
- 2. Anything in section 3 of the Pensions Ordinance, 1933, to the contrary notwithstanding, the pension granted to Vivian Charles Dias shall be, and is hereby declared to be, at the rate of one thousand eight hundred and forty-six dollars and twenty cents per annum, and the gratuity payable to the said Vivian Charles Dias shall be, and is hereby declared to be seven thousand six hundred and ninety-two dollars and fifty cents.
- 3. Save as in this Ordinance provided, the provisions of the Pensions Ordinance, 1933, shall apply to the pension granted to Vivian Charles Dias as though the said pension were granted under the aforesaid Ordinance.
- 4. This Ordinance shall come into operation on the 1st November, 1957.

Grant of special pension and gratuity to V. C. Dias. Cap. 73.

Pension to be subject to the provisions of the Pensions Ordinance, 1933.

Commencement.

OBJECTS AND REASONS

Mr. V. C. Dias, the Official Receiver, Public Trustee and Crown Solicitor will retire from the service with effect from the 1st November, 1957.

Prior to his permanent appointment with effect from the 11th June, 1947, Mr. Dias had acted continuously in that office from the 1st October, 1942, in place of Mr. P. W. King, the substantive holder of the post who was seconded for special duties.

In view of the length of time during which Mr. Dias acted for Mr. King prior to being confirmed in office it is considered right that the pension and gratuity payable to Mr. Dias should be computed as though his acting service were pensionable service.
