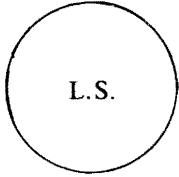

INSTRUMENT DESIGNATING SERVICE QUALIFYING FOR  
THE PAYMENT OF A STATE PENSION

WHEREAS it is provided by section 3(1) of the State Pensions Act, Chapter 27:04, that whenever the President considers it desirable, having regard to the nature and quality of the service rendered to the State by any person and to the special circumstances pertaining to the case, that such service should qualify for the payment of a State Pension, he may by instrument under the Seal of Guyana designate such service as qualifying for the payment of a State Pension:

NOW, THEREFORE, acting in accordance with the said provision and by virtue and in exercise of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I hereby designate the service rendered to the State by AGNES ANDERSON as qualifying for the payment of a State Pension with effect from 1st January, 1979.
