THE PHARMACY AND POISONS ORDINANCE, 1956
(No. 36 of 1956)

UNDER SECTION 9 (2) OF THE PHARMACY AND POISONS ORDINANCE, 1956 THE FOLLOWING RULES HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE PHARMACY AND POISONS BOARD WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL :—

1. These Rules may be cited as the Pharmacy and Poisons (Pharmacists) (Training and Examination) (Amendment) Rules, 1969, and shall be construed and read as one with the Pharmacy and Poisons (Pharmacists) (Training and Examination) Rules, 1968, *hereinafter referred to as the Principal Rules, and all amendments thereto.

2. Rule 19 of the Principal Rules is hereby revoked and the following rule substituted therefor —

“19 (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of rule 3 of these rules and without prejudice to the provisions of the following paragraph of this rule the Board may admit to the examinations, with or without exemptions from any subject thereof, any person holding a certificate or diploma from any college, society or other institution of a foreign country, where the Board is satisfied that the holder of such certificate has received adequate training in the relevant subjects of the examination.

(2) For the purposes of paragraph (d) of subsection (1) of section 9 of the Pharmacy and Poisons Ordinance, 1956, a person who holds a certificate or diploma of competency as a chemist and druggist from any college, society or other institution of a foreign country shall be entitled to be registered as a pharmacist if the Board considers that the course of training and instructions such person was required to

undergo in such college, society or other institution, as the case may be, prior to the award of such certificate or diploma is of a standard meriting registration."
