

COMMISSION

A COMMISSION TO INQUIRE INTO ALL ASPECTS OF THE OPERATIONS ON THE WATERFRONT IN THE PORT OF GEORGETOWN.

WHEREAS it is provided by the Commissions of Inquiry Ordinance, Chapter 59, that it shall be lawful for the Governor-General whenever he shall deem it advisable to issue a commission appointing two or more Commissioners and authorising such Commissioners or any quorum of them therein mentioned to inquire, inter alia, into any matter in which an inquiry would, in his opinion, be for the public welfare;

AND WHEREAS the Governor-General by commission on 18th December, 1968, (as amended on 14th January, 1969, and on 9th October, 1969,) appointed Dr. CLAUDE HICKS LENBOW, Dr. H. LUTCHMAN, S. J. O. OPPENHEIMER, ESQUIRE, KENNETH LESLIE WISHART, ESQUIRE, ALPHONSO Mc LEAN, ESQUIRE, to be Commissioners with the said Dr. CLAUDE HICKS DENBOW, as Chairman of the Commissioners to inquire into and report on the matters specified therein:

AND WHEREAS it is provided by section 3 of the said Ordinance that in case any commissioner shall be or become unable or unwilling to act, or shall die, the Governor-General may appoint another commissioner in his place;

AND WHEREAS the said Alphonso McLean, Esquire, has since died and Kenneth Leslie Wishart, Esquire, is unable to act as Commissioner;

NOW THEREFORE by virtue of the powers conferred on me by the said Ordinance and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I do hereby alter the said Commission of 18th December, 1968, (as amended on 14th January, 1969 and on 9th October, 1969) by appointing Dr. Wilfred Lascelles David, and Eustace Dodson, Esquire, as Commissionens in place of Kenneth Lestie Wishart, Esquire, and Alphonso McLean, deceased.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of Guyana at Guyana House, Georgetown, Guyana this 16th day of December, 1969 and in the eighteenth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
