(2) In this section and in section 33B "the Chief Fire Officer" includes any fit and proper person authorised by the Chief Fire Officer to examine premises and issue certificates for the purposes of these sections.

Revocation and suspension of offlicence. 33B.(1) The Chief Fire Officer may at any reasonable time enter and inspect any offlicence premises under this Act.

(2) Where upon any inspection as aforesaid the Chief Fire Officer is of the opinion that the premises are unfit for use for any of the purposes **specified** in paragraph (a) of section 3, he shall forthwith report the matter to the Comptroller who shall forthwith revoke or suspend the licence upon such terms as he may think fit.

33C.(1) For every certificate issued by the Chief Fire Officer under section 33A the licencee shall pay a fee of one hundred dollars.

(2) The Minister may by order vary the fee mentioned in subsection (1).".

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

This Bill seeks to increase the fees prescribed by the Fire Arms Act, the Registration of Births and Deaths Act, the Marriage Act, the Tax Act and the Indian Labour Act.

It seeks also to insert new provisions in the Intoxicating Liquor Licensing Act empowering the Comptroller of Customs and Excise to grant an off-licence only to an applicant in possession of a certificate of safety from the Chief Fire Officer, in respect of his premises, relating to the adequacy of provision as to the means of escape in the event of fire, and safety in general. The fee payable on issue of such a certificate is one hundred dollars.
