NATIONAL ARCHIVES OF GUYANA (AMENDMENT) BILL 1988

ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS

SECTION

1. Short title.
2. Repeal and re-enactment of section 5 of the Principal Act.

A BILL

Intituled

AN ACT to amend the National Archives of Guyana Act.

A. D. 1988 Enacted by the Parliament of Guyana:—

Short title Act 9 of 1982. 1. This Act, which amends the National Archives of Guyana Act, may be cited as the National Archives of Guyana (Amendment) Act 1988.

Repeal and reenactment of the Principal Act. 2. Section 5 of the Principal Act is hereby repealed and the following section substituted therefor —

“Advisory Committee. 5.(1) There shall be an Advisory Committee of which the Minister shall be the Chairman.

(2) The Committee shall consist of not less than four and not more than seven other members who shall be appointed by the Minister from amongst persons appearing to the Minister to be qualified and experienced in matters relating to the identification, custody, preservation and exploitation

(3) The members of the Committee shall hold office for two years from the date of appointment.

(4) The Committee shall advise the Minister on matters of general archival policy and review the work and progress of the National Archives.

(5) The Committee shall meet half yearly and may regulate its own procedure.

(6) There shall be paid to the members of the Committee such remuneration, if any, (whether by way of travelling or other allowances) as the Minister may determine.”

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

Clause 2 of the Bill seeks to reduce from twelve to seven the maximum number of persons required to constitute the Advisory Committee and to make the Minister the Chairman of the Committee instead of the Archivist.
