ORDER

Made Under THE LABOUR ACT (Chapter 98:01)

UNDER SECTION BOOF THE LABOUR ACT, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Minimum Wages (Employees at Petrol Filling Stations) Order 1977 and shall come into operation on 25th Novamber, 1977.

Citation and commencament

2. In this Order -

Interpreta-

employee means any parson employed at a petrol filling station.

"normal hours" mean the maximum number of hours which may normally be worked by an employee in accordance with the Hours of Work (Employees at Patrol Filling Stations) Regulations;

"petrol filling station" maens any place or pramises in respect of which a licence is required to be taken out under esction 61 of the Tax Act and includes any such place or premises where petroleum, and lubricants and accessories required for the repair of, or use in motor vehicles, are sold, or any such place or premises where motor vehicles are kept temporarily for the purpose of being classed or washed or for the purpose of carrying out running repairs or, making minor adjustments, to them.

Cap. 80:01

(1) Subject to this Order, the minimum te of wages payable to an employee in any of the categories of work set out in the first column of the Schedule shall be the rate set out in relation thereto in the second column of that Schedule.

Minimum Wage Rate Schedule

- (2) Where an amployee is in receipt of a way. higher than that prescribed by this Order, the employer shall nevertheless continue to pay to such employee wages at such higher rate.
- (3) The minimum rate of wages payable to an employee who is smplayed in any of the categories of work mentioned in the Schedule for any shorter periodof time than the appropriate period mentioned in the Schedule shall be the minimum rate of wages prescribed in relation thereto in respect of the last mentioned period.

Provided that an employer may pay to an employee who is employed in any of the categories of work mentioned in the Schadule 2000 than the minimum rate of wegoe per week prescribed in relation thereto in respect of any pariod of time less than the appropriate period mentioned in the said Schedule so that, however, such lesser rate pay day payable to a person so employed shall not be less than the prescribed minimum rate divided by six, together with twenty-five percent of such lesser rate.

(4) The minimum rate of wagos payable to an employed during any period of time mentioned in the Schedule in more than one category of work mentioned in the Schedule in respect of which different minimum rates of wages are prescribed, shall the higher or the highest of such rates, as the case may be.

- 4. (1) An amployee described in the first column of the Schedule, who, at the request of his employer, works in excess of the normal hours shall be paid for every hour or part thereof so worked, et one and one-half times the rate at which he would, but for this paragraph, be paid under this Order.
- (2) An employee described in the first column of the Schedule who is in receipt of a wage at a rate higher than thet proscribed in this Order, and who at the request of his employer, works in excess of the normal hours shall be peid for svery hour or part thereof so worked, at one and onehalf times such higher rate.
- (3) An employee described in the first column of the Schedule shall be paid in respect of work on Sundaye, Christian Dey, the day after Christmee Day if Christmac falls on a Sunday, Eid-ul-Ahza Day, or, if that day is on a Sunday, the following day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, that is to say the let May, or if that day is a Sunday, the following day at the rate of doubla the hourly rats.
- An employee described in the first column of tho Schedule shall be paid in respect of work on any public holiday other than as specified in paragraph (3), at the rate of ons and one-half times the hourly rate.
- An employed described in the first column of the Schedule who is in receipt of a wage at a rata higher than that prescribed in the said Schedule and who works on any of the days specified in paragraphs (3) and (4) shall be paid in respect of such work at the rate of double or ondered one-half times, as the case may bo, the higher rate of pay.
