Dear Sir,
The following is the report on the activities of the Post Office of the Republic of Guyana for the year ending December 31, 1973. Tables of statistics concerning the various services that were rendered during the year are annexed in the form of Appendices to the kep rt.

The practice of laying stress upon fresh records was maintained in the preparation of this report. This is evident in the fact that the statistics, as such, show the areas in which there has been progress and in which there was none.

The year 1973 has been for the Department, ne of consi derable increases in various areas of operations. The demands on the establishment and the servic facilities were very great but nevertheless, all efforts were made to serve as efficiently as possible with what was available.

The Guyana Postal Adrinistration was represented at a number of overseas conferences on Postal hffairs held during the . year. The benefits derived from those conferences could be measured in terms of the better quality of service which we were able to render as a sult of the experiences and knowledge gained from the conferences.

Much attertion was given to the needs of Po $t$ Offices throughout the country in crcler to ensure better accommodation fr staff and public. Such close attention iesuited in Bourda Post Office ing extended and better equipped to mee't the requirements of the public. Renovations etc. to a number of Pcit Office Counters were also carried out.

British Postal Orders issucd by rost Orfices throughout the country in 1973 numbered 33,399 valued at $\$ 224,627.00$ as against 32,805 valued at $\$ 198,902.80$ issued in 1972. The................. number of orders cashed was 114,821 valued at $\$ 2,304,141.00$ as compared rith 104,932 valued at, \$1,920,917.00 in 1972. Reveriue to the value of $\$ 2,5^{\prime} 65 . \hat{c}^{\prime}$. accrued to the Department as Commissicu vilucted for this Service.

## (iii) Inland Postal Orders:-

Inland Postal Orders issued during 1973 numbered 128,316 valued at $\$ 614,755.00$ as compared with 108,782 valued at $\$ 626,078.00$ issued in 1972. Orders cas'zed totalled 121,947 valued at $\$ 618,653.00$ as compared with 181,842 valued at $\$ 638,275.00$ in 1972. Revenue to the value of $\$ 9,228.00$ was collected as Commission for the sale of Inl and Postal Orders.
(d) Cash and Accounting Responsibility of the Department

The Cash and Accounting desponsibility of the Department amounted to $\$ 153,028,672.00$ in 1973 as compared to $\$ 153,334,292.00$ in 1972.
3. STAFF -
(a) Establishment:

In 1973, the Department's establishment comprised a Postmaster General, a Deputy Postmaster General, an Assistant Postmaster General and a postal operational staff of six hundred and eight (608) officers. This figure does not include Postal ligents numbering one hundred and four (104) and contractors numbering twenty-five (25).

4. POST OFFICES AND POSTAL AGENCIES -

1. The total number of Post Offices, Postal Agencies, Travelling Post Offices and Travelling Postall Agencies maintained during 1.973 was 160 - made up as follows:-

There was an increase of one (1) over the 1972 figure of 159. This resulted from the creation of a Postal Agency at Kwebanna. 2. Added to this there were 176 registered Stamp Vendors operating throughout the country.

## 5. INSPECTIONS:

Throughout 1973 regular inspections and checks on the accounts and operations of Post Offices and Postal ligencies were made by the Postmaster General, his Deputy and his Assistant, Regional Controllers of Posts, the Inspector of P. $t$ Offices and other postal officials.

1. The following Commemorative Postage Stamps were issued during 1973:-
(1) Republic Day 1973 - denominations 0 8, 25, 40 and 50 cents.
(2) Easter 1973 - denominations of 8, 2 , 40 and 50 cents.
(3) Red Cross Day 1973 - denominations f 8, 25, 40 and 50 cents.
(4) Christmas 1973 - denominations of 8 25, 40 and 50 cents.
2. Prepaid aerogrammes were introduced and half of the cost was defrayed by a trade exchange with British West In ian Airways Corporation.
3. Revenue from the sale of Postage Stamps and Neopost Stamps amounted to $\$ 2,764,713.00$ as against $\$ 2,759,005.00$ in 1972. Stamp sales through Franking Machines amounted to $\$ 790,125.00$ as against $\$ 784,279.00$ in 1972.

## 7. MAIL SERVICES - ィPPENDIX III -

(a) Inland Surface:

The Services of the Transport and Harbours Department continued to be used as the main conveyance of mail. In areas where those services were not available, conveyance was effec ed by Guyana TransportServices, the transport services of this D?partme $t$ and by private persons contracted for such operations.
(b) Inland:...

The Air Mail services to the Rupun , Bartica, Mazaruni, the North West District and other hinterland area were operated by Guyana Airways Corporation.
(c) Overseas Surface:

During the year 15,093 bags of sur ace mail came into the Postal Service by 64 vessels. Compared with the 972 figure of 13,314 bags brought by 154 vessels, there was an increas in the flow of mail but a marked reduction in the number of mail vess ls. Mails were received by direct despatch from the United Kingdom by essels owned by Bookers, Royal Dutch, Harrison, Susin. :- and Booth Lines, and also via Trinidad. All despatches to the United Kingdom were made by Booker Lines which operated regulor services. The United States con inued to be served by vessels operated by Atlantic Lines and Canada was served by Booth Lines and Saguenay vessels.

The West Indies were served via $T$ dad by vessels of Bookers Coastal shipping which operated a monthly service. Surinam was served via Springlands by the "S.S. Perica" weekl .

The volume of mail in this category handled both inward and outward during the year increased from 42,958,798, pieces in 1972 to 47,854,628 pieces in 1973.
8. PARCEL POST - APDTIDTX IV -
(a) General:

Compared with 1972 when the total number of parcels handled amounted to 124,305 the figure for 1973 was 138,384 giving a total increase of 14,079 in the volume handled.
(b) Overseas Surface:

The number of parcels received and despatched by the Guyana Administration during 1973 was 52,252. In comparison with the 1972 figure of 50,714 , there was an increase of 1,538 .
(c) Overseas Air:

Incoming and Outgoing Air Parcels Mail during 1973 totalled 38,278. Parcels received totalled 28,452 as compared with 23,462 showing a total increase of 4,990 over the 1972 figure. Parcels despatched amounted to 9,826 as compared with 9,212 in 1972. This showed an increase of 614 as compared with the 1972 figure.
(d) Customs Revenue:

The amount of Customs Revenue collected on incoming parcels and packets 'during 1973 totalled $\$ 169,868,00$.
9. RADIO LICENCL - APPENDIX V -

The number of Radio Licences issued during the year under review was 49,204 giving a cash value of $\$ 73,806.00$. Set against the 1972 figure of 49,607 valued at $\$ 74,410.50$ there was a slight decrease of 403 valued at $\$ 604.50$

## 10. CONCLUSION -

The Postal Department remained in the vanguard of the Country's drive to Feed, Clothe and House itself by 1976; always keeping abreast of the $\mathrm{F}^{\circ}$ oncers in their efforts to populate the vast interior and tap its wealth of rich farmland and mineral resource s.

Despite severe financial stringency some progress has undoubtedly been made and the year ended on a distinct note of hopefulness for the future.
