THE MINISTERS, MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY AND
SPECIAL OFFICES (EMOLUMENTS) ORDINANCE, 1965.

(No. 7 of 1965)

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON ME BY SECTION
8 OF THE MINISTERS, MEMBERS OF THE HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY
AND SPECIAL OFFICES (EMOLUMENTS) ORDINANCE 1965, I
HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Ministers, Members of the National Assembly and Special Offices (Emoluments) Order 1977 and shall be deemed to have come into operation on July 24, 1977.

2. The schedule to the Ordinance is hereby amended in the following respects—

(a) by the substitution for paragraph 2 of the following paragraph —

“2. The Attorney-General (whether or not a Minister) shall be paid a salary at the rate of \$24,000 per annum.”;

(b) by the deletion from paragraph 6 of the words “and the Attorney-General, if he is not a Minister.”; and

(c) by the addition of the following paragraph

“14. The Attorney-General (whether or not a Minister) shall be paid an entertainment allowance of \$200 per month, a duty allowance of \$400 per month and he shall be entitled to occupy free of rent a furnished residence provided by the Government or in lieu thereof, to be paid a house allowance of \$250 per month.”
