THE LABOUR ORDINANCE,  
(Chapter 103).

UNDER SECTION 8 (3) OF THE LABOUR ORDINANCE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH (1) OF ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Minimum Wages (Shirt and Garment Workers) (Amendment) Order 1962, and shall be construed and read with the Minimum Wages (Shirt and Garment Workers) Order, 1960\* hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order.

2. Article 2 of the Principal Order is hereby amended by the insertion immediately after the definition of the expression “semi-skilled workers” of the following new definition —

“stoppage of work” means any cessation of work at a shirt or garment factory occasioned by shortage of materials, breakdown of mechanical plant or equipment, or failure of power supply where the source of the power supply is owned or operated by the occupier of a shirt or garment factory or where the cessation of work is due to any circumstances whatever over which the employer has control, but shall not include any cessation of work occasioned by a strike or lockout arising out of an industrial or trade dispute;”
