THE PUBLIC HEALTH ORDINANCE,

(Chapter 145)

UNDER SECTIONS 69 AND 157 OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH ORDINANCE THE CENTRAL BOARD OF HEALTH HAS MADE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE GOVERNOR ACTING IN ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH 1 OF ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Public Health (Mosquito Control) (Amendment) Regulations, 1961, and shall be construed and read with the Public Health (Mosquito Control) Regulations, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations. Short title.

2. The Principal Regulations are hereby amended by — Amendment to  
Principal  
Regulations.

(a) the renumbering of regulations 18 and 19 thereof as regulations 19 and 20 respectively; and

(b) by the insertion of the following as regulation 18 —

Digging of earth on roads etc.

18. (1) No person shall, without the permission in writing of the local sanitary authority —

(a) dig or remove any earth from any dam, reserve or other land so as to lower the surface thereof in such a manner as may cause any collection of water liable to breed mosquitoes;

(b) dig any pond or reservoir on any premises;

(c) dig any borrow pits on any premises for the burning of earth or any purpose whatsoever.

(2) No person shall cause or allow any depressions to remain on any premises so as to cause an accumulation or stagnation of water liable to breed mosquitoes.”

18. (1) No person shall, without the permission in writing of the local sanitary authority —

(a) dig or remove any earth from any dam, reserve or other land so as to lower the surface thereof in such a manner as may cause any collection of water liable to breed mosquitoes;

(b) dig any pond or reservoir on any premises;

(c) dig any borrow pits on any premises for the burning of earth or any purpose whatsoever.

(2) No person shall cause or allow any depressions to remain on any premises so as to cause an accumulation or stagnation of water liable to breed mosquitoes.”
