SECTION I

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SECTION I - VITAL STATISTICS, 1959

A-INTRODUCTORY

- 1.0 At the end of 1959 the population of British Guiana including Amerindians recorded the magnificent total of 559,070. However, the population excluding these indigenous people was estimated at 536,880. The specific reason advanced for making separate estimates of these two populations is that Amerindian Registration for the most part has been so incomplete and in every respect lacking that it would be fictitious to include them in the general biostatistical studies of the General Register Office.
- 1.1. There was no significant change in the features that contribute to the growth of the population. The birth rate continued to be cyclically high whilst the low crude death rate maintained its downward trend. The emphasis that was hitherto placed on combating the ravages of diseases and the resultant high death rates of the past must now be diverted into providing for the welfare of a rapidly increasing population occasioned by phenomenal fertility and high natural increase rates on one side and a low receding death rate on the other.
- 1.2. The registration of vital events for Amerindians must still be considered incomplete, especially in the hinderland where the majority of them dwell. Government has already achieved much with regard to providing for the welfare of these people and with the full implementation of the development programme, it is hoped, in the near future, that this racial group would benefit substantially. Full registration coverage of this particular group would materialize in the not too distant future as the need for preparing reasonably accurate statistics cannot be over emphasized especially when it is considered as the only means of assessing their progress and of determining the extent which they will participate in the numerous planning and welfare schemes put forward by the Government.
- 1.3. In order that a comprehensive picture may be painted of the Colony's demographic and vital trends, a separate table on Amerindians has been included hereunder. The figures are based on the partly estimated and the partly enumerated Amerindian population of the census of 1946 and the table is built up through the post-censal years from available registered events of their births and deaths

"B" — POPULATION

- 2.0. British Guiana's population excluding Amerindians at the 31st December, 1959 was 536,880 as compared with 519,130 at the end of 1958 and 368,340 at the Census of the 9th April, 1946.
- 2.1. There was a net increase of 17,740 or 3.4 percent during the year under review and 168,540 or 45.8 percent since 1946. Comparative figures for the preceding year were 16,461 or 3.3 per cent and 150,791 or 40.9 per cent respectively. Progressive annual accretions in population have been maintained since 1946. The year 1950 was the only exception. The net increase of 17,740 for the year under review was due to the natural increase of 18,191 registered births over deaths less an adverse migration balance of 451.

- 2.2. The 1959 population comprised 268,430 males and 268,450 females. These numbers indicate an increase of 9,150 or 3.5 per cent and 8,600 or 3.3 per cent respectively over the male component of 259,280 and female component of 259,850 of the 1958 population. The proportion of males per 1,000 females was 999.93 as compared with 997.8 for 1958. The natural increase for males was more than that for females by 189. This was an adherence to the normal trend which only showed deviation during the year 1956 when females exceeded males by 62.
- 2.3. Population estimates by age distribution have been prepared only for (a) all races excluding Amerindians and (b) East Indians separately. In fact it continues to be evident that though in the main, the East Indians continue to maintain their racial identity, the general inter-mingling of races is making population analysis in terms of other races somewhat unrealistic in this territory.
- 2.4. For this reason, the presentation of vital rates for racial groups other than East Indians has been discontinued.
- 2.5. The preparation of rates for the East Indians, is however, fully justified not only because their group is as yet not heavily involved in miscegenation, but also because rates of increase of phenomenal magnitude are reflected thereby. It is interesting to note that while the sex ratio of the total population excluding East Indians is 953.5 males to every 1,000 females, the corresponding ratio for the East Indian population is 1,048.3 males to every 1,000 females. It would appear therefore that while custom and religion may be the essential influencing factors in holding the East Indians together as a race, sex ratio disparity may be a strong contributing force towards this end.
- 2.5. The following approximate racial distribution of the population for 1959 should be of interest. From this table, the predominance of females over males for all other racial groups except East Indians and Chinese is noteworthy. There is evidence of increasing miscegenation of the Chinese people. The product of this mixture is reflected in the "Mixed Races" group.

2.6. A detailed study of population increases in the several age divisions over the past five years is possible from Table I. The significance of this growth since 1946, however, can only be adequately assessed from an analytical study of the four broad age groups 0-4 years, representing children under school age; 5-14 years, representing children of school age; 15-64 years representing child bearing and working age population; and 65 years and over representing dependents past working age. The changes between 1946 and 1959 are as follows:—

- 2.7. Population growth under 5 years continues to be striking. The highest numerical and percentage increases for the period 1946 1957 were recorded for the group 0 4 years, bearing witness to the notable decline in mortality and morbidity rates, the irregular but yet definite trend in the decline of neonatal and infant mortality rates, and high fluctuating birth rates. The percentage increase for the group 5-14 years continued to be high and progressive for the same period. The problem of school accommodation would seem likely to continue to be a challenging one as long as these progressional increases gain momentum with each successive year. There were sufficiently large increases in all age groups for the period 1946 1947 as may be termed substantial, but the increase of 30.1 for the group 15-64 years is most significant since it encompasses that portion of the population whose reproductivity, supported by a steady declining death rate, is the determinant factor of this country's young and rapidly growing population.
- 2.8. What has been said of the entire population in the preceding paragraph is especially true of its East Indian component, since population growth in British Guiana is overwhelmingly influenced by the rapid growth of this racial group. The increases in the East Indian population between 1946 and 1959 can be briefly summarised as follows:—

2.9. Within the period 1946-1959, East Indians had accounted for 59.5 per cent of the corresponding age group population of the whole colony. The percentage increase of 100.7% for this group was indeed spectacular. The 0-4 age group population actually doubled itself in 13 years. There were notable increases in all the selected age groups and most noticeable was the fact that in every age group the rates of increase of the East Indian sector were considerably higher than the corresponding rates for all the races put together. The increase of 71.1% in the group 5-14 years is by no means of little importance in determining the intensity of school expansion programmes. Significant, however, is the increase of 44.0% for the group 15-64 years since these persons are directly responsible for the high reproductive rates among East Indians and for the country as a whole. In every age group there were marked signs of population increases which support the abundant evidence of a steadily declining death rate even in the more susceptible age groups of 0-4 years and 65 years and over.

C — FERTILITY

- 3.0. During 1959 the total number of births registered (excluding the Amerindian births) was 23,470 or 739 more than the preceding year. Male births outnumbered female births by 11,933 to 11,537. The sex ratio was 1034.3 as compared with 1024.0 in 1958 when male births were 11,500 and female births 11,231.
 - 3.1. The illegitimate rate was 34.1 as compared with 36.0 in 1958.
- 3.2. The birth rate for 1959 was 44.5 per 1,000 estimated population as compared with 44.5 in 1958. In 1952 it was 44.3, the highest mark ever reached in the history of vital registration in British Guiana and probably for any West Indian territory. With a rate of 44.5 per 1,000 another record peak has been reached in conformity with the cyclic yet upward secular pattern of increase that is characteristic of this country's birth rate.

- 3.3. The calculated crude birth-rate based on the total mean population is useful as a measure of natural increases in population and welfare and economic activities associated with neo-natal and other post-natal population. It is, however, misleading and cannot be taken as a satisfactory index of fertility trends, particularly for a reasonable period of time removed from the base year. The number of birth occurrences is determined primarily by the reproductive female population within the 15-45 years age group. There is a steady and significant expansion of this age group which is predominantly female as stated herein, thus the high fluctuating pattern of the birth rate will tend to understate the high fertility being experienced in British Guiana.
- 3.4. Fertility trends continue to be impressive and phenomenal from a cursory observation of available data. Indications are that there is a significant influx of young mothers into the productive age groups, and from the fertility experience of their predecessors, it is sufficiently evident that the cyclic pattern of the crude birth rate will continue to rise, reaching a higher miximum value at the peak of each cycle for some time to come
- 3.5. There were 2,038 marriages recorded in the General Register Office during 1959 as compared with 1,948 in 1958. The marriage rate was 3.9 for every 1,000 persons of the population as against 3.8 in 1958. Legal East Indian marriages performed under the Indian Labour Ordinance, Chapter 104 are filed with the Immigration Agent General and there were 1,568. The total number of legal marriages were therefore 3,606 giving a true marriage rate of 6.7.

D — MORTALITY

- 4.0. The number of deaths registered during 1959 was 5,279 as compared with 5,195 during 1958. Of this number, 2,743 were males and 2,536 females as against 2,646 males and 2,549 females in 1958. There was an increase of 84 or 6.45% above the total occurrences for 1958 and in both years male deaths exceeded female deaths by 207 and 97 respectively. Deaths among East Indians increased numerically from 2,371 in 1958 to 2,466 in 1959 *i.e.* by 95. The death rate for East Indians was again lower than that for the total population. It was 9.3 per 1,000 estimated mean population.
- 4.1. Deaths among children under one year of age decreased to 1,340 during 1959 as against 1,459 in 1958 and 1,489 in the previous year. The infant mortality rate again dropped from 61.2 in 1958 to 57.1 in 1959.
- 4.2. The ten principal causes of death for the year 1959 differed in several aspects from those of 1958 and preceding years. Deaths from Pneumonia and Bronchitis reached its peak with the phenomental total of 667, the highest ever to be recorded against this disease, thereby producing a rate of 119.3, which marked an increase of 21.3 over the previous year, when it was placed third on the list with a total of 530 and a rate of 98.0. Diseases of early infancy showed a historical drop to second place with a total of 602 and a rate of 107.7, a fact truly demonstrative of the efforts of the authorities in neonatal care. It may be mentioned here that for the past seven years deaths from diseases of early infancy have always occupied 1st place with a rate showing a slight drop throughout the years. A linear graph plotted to show the trend of the disease over the years points clearly to the fact that the peak having been reached it now assumed a definite pattern and according to expectations may very well drop considerably within the next few years. Diseases of the heart crept 1 place higher than the previous year with a total of 520 and a rate of 93.0, whilst Gastro Enteritis and Colitis dropped from second place to fourth. Ill defined diseases maintained its customary position as fifth whilst Senility without mention of Psychosis interchanged positions with Vascular Lesions affecting Central Nervous System. Malignant Neoplasms with a slightly lowered rate of 42.6 remained as eighth. Diseases of the Nervous System replaced Nephritis (all forms) as ninth, which together with Tuberculosis (all forms) can now be regarded as safely under control to some extent. Influenza with a total of 137 and a rate of 24.5 is now placed as the tenth important cause of death thereby replacing Diseases of the Nervous System. The disappearance of Nephritis and Tuberculosis from the list is indeed most notable.

E — NATURAL INCREASE

- 5.0. The year 1950 interrupted in varying degrees the yearly progressive trend of vital registration as reflected in the vital statistics prepared in this Department. The natural increase rate (i.e. births over deaths) rose steadily after 1950 to reach the magnificent figure of 34.5. in 1959. During the year 1959 births exceeded deaths by 18,191, which apart from being more than double the increase in the census year 1946 is the highest ever to be recorded for this territory. As late as 1919, it was not unusual for Natural decreases to be recorded. The average natural decrease for the period 1916 1919 was as high as 2,514.
- 5.1. The natural increase rate including Amerindians reached 3.08% for the first time in 1952 and repeated itself in 1953. With the exception of the year 1954, this rate continued on a steady progressive upward trend and now stands at 3.4% for the year under review. The natural increase for East Indians is an important one. Using the year 1946 as a base, it would be noted that whenever the Natural Increase rate for the whole colony increased, the corresponding increase in rate for East Indians was almost twice as much, and whenever there was a drop in rate for the Whole Colony, the decrease in the rate for East Indians fluctuated similarly. During the period 1946 1947, the increase rate for all races was 4.9, while that for the East Indian was 7.9 almost double. During the period 1945 1949, the drop for the Whole Col-

ony was 3.2, while that for East Indians was 5.2. It is evident from these direct variations in rate that contribution from the East Indian component of the population was determining the natural increase of the entire population of British Guiana to the extent of almost 50%. The natural increase rate for East Indians was 41.0 per 1,000 mean population in 1959 as against 41.1 for 1958. In 1946, the East Indian population accounted for 45.6% of the total population and by the end of 1959 it had reached 48.2% It is evident that from this rate of increase, the East Indian population will reach over half the total population within a few years. For the reproductivity of this racial group continues to account for levels of population growth of such magnitude in British Guiana.

SECTION II - DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITIES

DISTRICTS AND DIVISIONS

- 1.0 At the 31st January, 1959, British Guiana was divided into 27 districts for the registration of births and deaths. These districts were sub-divided into 123 divisions. Each district was supervised by a Superintendent Registrar generally the Government Medical Officer of the corresponding medical district. Each registration division or sub-district was under the charge of a registrar of births an deaths, and in his absence, a deputy registrar.
- 1.1 In 52 of the divisions, the registrars were "public officers", a term which for the purposes of the Department, includes Postmasters, Postal Agents, Government Dispensers and School Teachers. In the remaining 71 divisions 20 of the registrars were dispensers employed by sugar estates. Where the registrar is a public officer or a sugar estate employee, there is no deputy provided since the public officer or sugar estate employee is appointed *ex-officio*, and in cases of temporary absence or permanent transfer, there is always immediate replacement.
- 1.2. The table below shows the registration districts, with the number of divisions and registrars who are Public Officers, sugar estate dispensers, and private persons. Each district is also now given a county number, the letters B, D and E signifying Berbice, Demerara and Essequibo respectively.

^{1.3.} The Registrar General's series of preliminary visits to divisional registrars, which began in November, 1954, were continued intermittently during 1959. Registration Centres in all three counties were visited.

1.4. These visits, which were still in the nature of "familiarization tours" revealed many incomsistencies in the Districts and emphasised the need for training Registrars in the modern methods of registration by holding a regular series of 'Seminars.'

1. MARRIAGE OFFICERS

- 2.0 There were in British Guiana at 31st December, 1959, 224 Marriage Officers duly appointed under the Marriage Ordinance, Chapter 164, and representing the various Christian denominations. There were 10 civil registrars of marriages (or superintendent registrars) The names and addresses of the marriage officers and civil registrars of marriages are set out in Appendix 1 as well as the names and addresses of the Registrars and Superintendent Registrars of births and deaths.
- 2.1 The denomination with the largest number of marriage officers was the Roman Catholic with 63 followed by the Church of England with 35. The number of registered marriage officers during 1959 under "Other Denominations" was 126.
- 2.2 Sixteen Muslim and ten Himdu Priests were appointed marriage. officers under section 2 of the Marriage (Amendment) Ordinance No. 35 of 1959. These are not included among the 203 Marriage Officers referred to at 2.0.

2. BUILDINGS REGISTERED FOR THE PUBLICATION OF BANNS OF MARRIAGE.

3.0 Twenty-two buildings were registered for the publication of banns of marriage during 1959. There were 5 registrations under the provisions of the regulations under section 72 made in 1917 for the publication of banns of marriages of Amerindians. No fee is payable in respect of the latter registrations.

3.1 REGISTRATIONS.

4.0. The number of registrations effected during 1959 (including Amerindians) is set out below. Figures for the previous two years are shown for comparison.

4. GENERAL REGISTER OFFICE.

A — HEADQUARTER STAFF, ORGANISATION, ETC.

- 5.0. At the end of 1959 the authorised staff numbered 21, two being temporary assistants. There were many transfers, changes and replacements during this period.
- 5.1. The practice of requesting other Departments to detail their officers during the year to extract crude statistical data for their own purposes was continued. This was due to the innumerable and varied requests from both local and foreign sources. The refinement and interpretation of extracted data were done by the Statistical Clerks of the General Register Office.
- 5.2. Strenuous efforts were made to reduce the time-lag between the dates of application and issue of certified extracts from the registrars. This time lag was appreciably reduced to delivery dates within three days from the date of application.

5.3. Storage proposals to set up a Branch service in the county of Berbice made little headway. The accommodation of new registers of vital events has been a problem for sometime now, and it is primarily for this reason that much effort has been concentrated on the introduction of microfilming.

B — CENSUSES, POPULATION ESTIMATES, ETC.

- 6.0. Population Estimates derived from the Census of 1946 give the figures for Amerindians separately, since at that Census large numbers of these indigenous people were not exactly enumerated. Proposals submitted during 1955 for a special census of the Amerindian population were still under consideration.
- 6.1. A main difficulty in supplying population estimates to other Government Departments is the great variety of departmental districts with their overlapping boundaries. Attention was called to the administrative handicap in the report of Mr. Eric Mills, C.B.E., Public Service Investigator and was made mention of in the last Annual Report of this Department.

C — ORDINANCES, ET

- 5. 7.0. The Ordinances which govern or affect the functions of the General Register Office are, in the new Edition of the Laws of British Guiana, as follows; The Registration of Births and Deaths Ordinance, (Chapter 162), the Civil Aviation (Births, Deaths and missing persons) Ordinance, (Chapter 163) the Marriage Ordinance (Chapter 164) and the Legitimacy Ordinance (Chapter 165). (The Procedure for inserting baptismal names, or correcting an entry in the Register is given in Rules 15 and 16 of the Summary Jurisdiction (Civil Procedure) Rules made under Chapter 12). There are also contingent responsibilities under Chapters 64, 65 and 66 (Census and Electoral Laws). Divisional Registrars are required to perform duties under the Vaccination Ordinance (Chapter 146). For geneological and similar information issued under the seal of the Registrar General, a fee of \$1, is charged under Section 9 of the Tax Ordinance (Chapter 298) wherein is also prescribed at Sub-section (24), the fee payable to the Honourable Chief Secretary for a Marriage Licence. The marriage and divorce of persons introduced or coming into the colony from Asia and of their descendants is the administrative responsibility of the Immigration Agent General under the Indian Labour Ordinance, Chapter 104.
- 7.1 An Ordinance (No. 12 of 1955) to make provision for the adoption of children requires the Registrar General to keep an Adoption Children Register and Index thereof and do certain other acts.

6. FINANCIAL.

- 8.0. Searches, Certified Extracts Fees. The number of certified copies of entries issued during 1958 was 12,372 as compared with 14,788 certified copies issued during 1959.
- 8.1 There has been a steady increase in the number of extracts issued over the past 10 years. In 1946, the Department was required to handle only 5,436; by 1950 this figure had been nearly doubled. The table below compares the two years 1958 and 1959.
