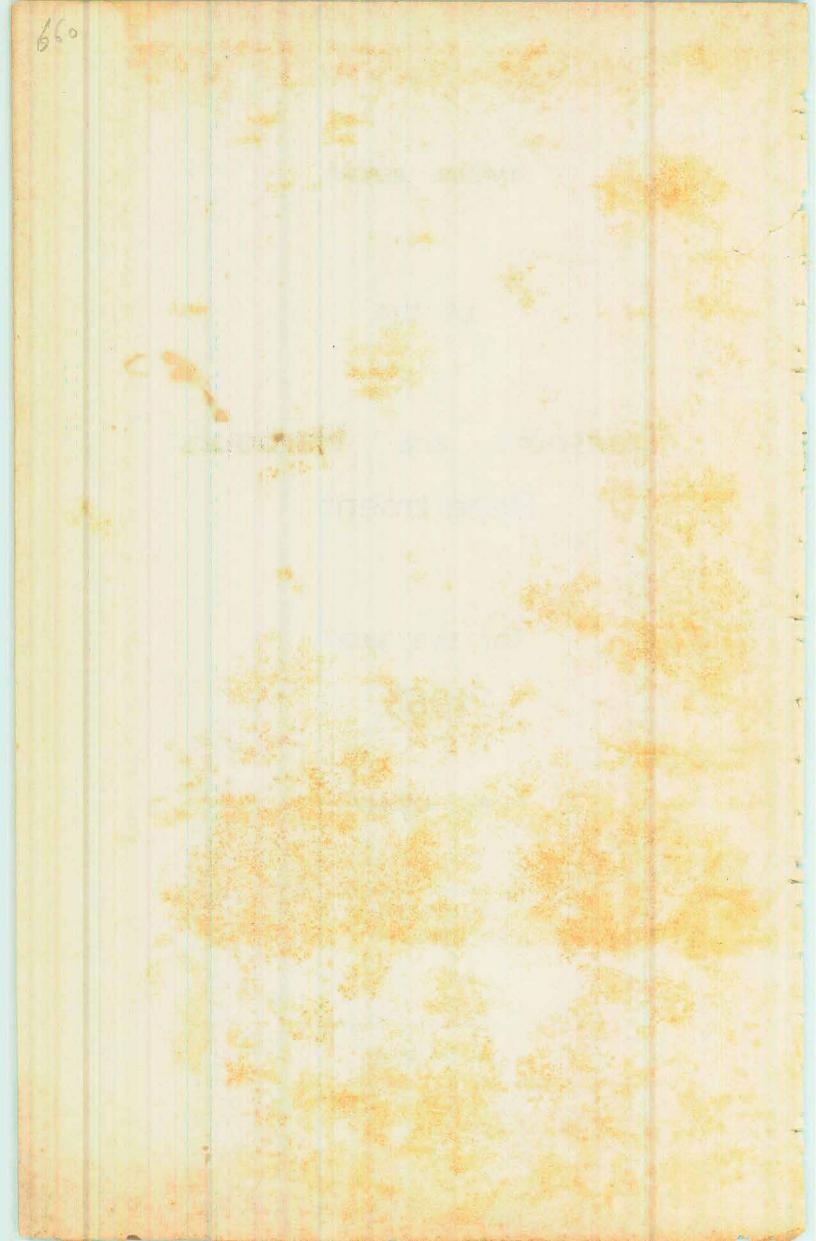

REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE

- 2. The year under review will long be remembered in the history of the T.&H.D. for it was one in which all of the services remained idle for some three months.
- 3. On 20th April, 1963, the Trades Union Council called a General Strike, bringing all forms of public transport to a halt. The Strike lasted for eighty days and was the determining factor in the loss of revenue to this Department, \$2,335,031 being collected at the end of the year as compared with \$3,026,729 for 1962.
- 4. The total expenditure of \$4,515,567 for 1963 was lower by \$350,398 than the amount of \$4,865,965 incurred under the same head in 1962. Savings in expenditure could have been further increased to \$467,654 had it not been necessary to provide for the retroactive cost of living award to Pensioners, accommodation for the Corporation and the unexpected voluntary retirement of employees. The additional expenditure incurred was largely responsible for the overall deficit of \$2,180,537 on the T. & H.D. Services for 1963.

GENERAL SURVEY

- 5. Passenger train journeys on the East and West Coast Railways for 1963 totalled 2,258,067 as compared with 4,043,701 during the previous year, reflecting a 44% decrease in coaching utilisation.
- 6. It was not possible to operate the railway services immediately after the strike on account of the long neglect of the permanent way which had to be made good and the other safety factors which had to be taken into consideration.
- 7. As a result of this and of the fact that the existing rolling stock is very old and over-taxed, train services were reduced on both railways to conserve equipment. This meant re-scheduling the rail services and a few ferry connections.
- 8. It is estimated that during the strike period the Department lost two million journeys, not to mention the freight on several tons of cargo. The shipping service to the Pomeroon was considered to be uneconomic and a decision was taken to discontinue the service immediately after the general strike ended on 7th July, 1963.
- 9. During the year it was found possible to make some desirable improvements to satisfy the needs of the travelling public. Additional seating accommodation was provided at the Georgetown Railway Station for passengers and school children. Also a ramp was constructed at Kitty Railway Station to facilitate motor cycle and pedal cycle traffic.
- 10. The schedule of the adventure Passenger Service was re-adjusted to afford residents of Essequibo and Georgetown more opportunities for travel on certain days of the week and in so doing the m.v. "Malali" was retimed to spend a longer turn-round time at Adventure.

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- 11. Some progress was made with the rehabilitation of Wakenaam Stelling and a start was made on the reconstruction of the stelling at Springlands in the Corentyne River. It is hoped to complete both projects early next year.
- 12. The total tonnage of cargo carried on the combined Rai way and Shipping Services during 1963 was 128,588 tons as compared with 186,789 tons carried in 1962. The drop in cargo traffic is attributable to the eighty day general strike in the country.
- 13. During 1963, 398 claims for non-delivery of cargo were received as compared with 411 of the previous year.

BRIEF REVIEW OF THE SERVICES

- 14. The decrease in revenue earnings under all heads, as shown in Table II above, resulted from the general strike. The operating deficit for 1963 increased by \$149,000 over the 1962 figure and was mainly due to the loss of some 700,000 passenger journeys.
- 15. Passenger journeys for the year 1963 totalled 1,174,405 as compared with 2,268,541 during the previous year, reflecting a 48% decrease in coaching utilisation.
- 16. The total tonnage of goods traffic handled during 1963 was 34,569 tons and this was 37% or 20,389 tons less than the 54,958 tons of cargo carried in 1962.

- 17. Passenger traffic was again the chief revenue earner; 1,283,974 passengers, calculated on the basis of passenger journeys, paid \$276,101.
- 18. Goods traffic dropped from 21,823 tons in 1962 to 17,569 tons in 1963, but it is pleasing to record an increase of 2,066 tons in molasses traffic. The bay at Vreed-en-Hoop and the approaches which the molasses punts use to take delivery of the molasses from the railway tank-wagons were subject to accretion during the latter part of 1961, and it was not possible for punts to use the bay except at Spring Tides. This made it rather difficult to off-load molasses from rail tanks into punts by the normal gravity-feed process and caused the Estate to divert some of this traffic from rail to their own punts during the neap tides for carriage around the coast by sea. A rotary pump has now solved the problem.

SHIPPING AND FERRY SERVICES

- 19. The following services were maintained: -
 - (i) A thrice-weekly passenger and cargo service between Georgetown and Bartica.
 - (ii) A twice-weekly cargo service between Georgetown, Essequibo Islands and Essequibo Coast.
 - (iii) A twice-weekly cargo service between Georgetown and New Amsterdam
 - (iv) A weekly passenger and cargo service between Georgetown and the North West District.
 - *(v) A fortnightly passenger and cargo service between Georgetown and the Pomeroon District.
 - (vi) A weekly passenger and cargo service between New Amsterdam and Ituni, Berbice River.
 - (vii) A weekly launch service between New Amsterdam and Kwakwani, Berbice River.
 - (viii) A weekly launch service between New Amsterdam and Ikuruwa, Canje
 - (ix) Demerara Ferry Service between Georgetown and Vreed-en-Hoop.
 - (x) Berbice Ferry Service between Rosignol and New Amsterdam.
 - (xi) Essequibo Ferry Service between Parika, Essequibo Islands and Adventure.

*This service was withdrawn on 18th July, 1983.

- 20. It can be seen from Table IV above that the total revenue from shipping and ferry services dropped from \$1,472,000 in 1962 to \$1,209,000 in 1963 and that expenditure also dropped from \$2,434,000 to \$2,273,000. However, the operating deficit rose to \$1,064.000 which is 11% higher than the previous year's figure. This is attributable to the expenses incurred in watching, maintaining reactivating the fleet as a result of the general strike.
- 21. The Department carried 76,450 tons of cargo on the combined shipping and ferry services during 1963, that is, 33,558 tons less than in 1962. There were sharp decreases in cargo tonnages on all the individual services as Appendix III shows, but indications are that there will be considerable improvement when conditions within the country become normal.
- 22. The discontinuation of the Pomeroon River Service immediately after the end of the general strike contributed to the control of expenditure on the shipping services. This service was costly to maintain because very little was carried in T. & H.D. bottoms in either direction since the residents of the Pomeroon seemed to favour sloop transport which had been in competition with the T.&H.D. Service for some years.
- 23. Some progress was made with the rehabilitation of Wakenaam Stelling and it is expected that the project will be completed early next year. When completed, the new stelling will have an overall floor area, more than one-third greater than the old floor area, and an important feature of the design will be the separation of passenger facilities from those provided for cargo. A new ramp, more than 17 feet wide, will allow for the safe conveyance of heavy agricultural machinery.
- 24. During the year the construction of a new stelling at Springlands was undertaken by this Department in preparation for the expected rice traffic from that area. It is expected that this stelling will be completed in the coming year.

The following services were maintained by ten diesel trucks during the year:-

- (a) Bartica to Issano on the Mazaruni River, and
- (b) Bartica to the Potaro River District.
- 25. Passenger journeys increased from 5,917 to 6,814 in 1963, but unfortunately the revenue collected in this regard was insufficient to push passenger receipts over and above the 1962 total. A short-journey service was introduced to Mazaruni-West area in 1963 and was responsible for the seeming imbalance in passenger revenue.
- 26. Cargo traffic amounted to 1,393 tons in 1963, that is, 179 tons less than 1,572 tons carried in 1962. This was mainly due to the general strike and to competition from privately owned vehicles.
- 27. The demand for the road service fluctuates according to the production of gold and diamonds and the discovery of new areas for mining, hence it is difficult to plan transport requirements for it. Expenditure on the service for 1963 was higher than the 1962 figure by \$30,143 and was a result of the capital outlay to purchase new lorries.

Harbour Services:

28. The Transport & Harbours Department operates a compulsory pilotage service in Georgetown and New Amsterdam harbours and in the Essequibo River as far as the small town of Bartica. The Department also enforces the Harbour Regulations and receives payment of tonnage and light dues and pilotage fees. The number of pilotage operations recorded in 1963 was 2,369 and the table below shows the number of vessels on which light and tonnage dues were collected.

The gross revenue collected in respect of pilotage, light and tonnage dues amounted to \$787,728 for 1963, as compared with \$1,011,862 for 1962.

GENERAL ADMINISTRATION

Staffing:

- 29. The posts of Harbour Master, Chief Pilot, Marine Superintendent and Civil Engineer are yet to be filled, but during the year under review, fifty-seven promotions were made within the Department in contrast to the fifty-two retirements and twelve resignations which were recorded.
- 30. During 1963, there was a decrease in the number of accidents to workmen. Two hundred and twenty-eight accidents were recorded as against three hundred and fifteen for 1962.

Industrial Relations:

- 31. Apart from meetings between Heads of Branches and representatives of sections of the Transport Workers Union, Management met members of the Central Executive of the Union on fourteen occasions to discuss such matters as disciplinary action, departmental procedure and other kindred subjects.
- 32. The Department was involved in one general strike and two partial stoppages of work during the year under review.

Transport Advisory Council:

33. The Transport Advisory Council met on ten occasions during the year.
