REGULATIONS

Made Under

THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE,

(Chapter 280).

UNDER SECTION 98 (3) OF THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR-IN-COUNCIL :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic (Amendment) Regulations, 1960.

2. Part A of the First Schedule to the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Ordinance*, as amended from time to time, is hereby further amended:

(a) by the deletion of paragraph 18 and the substitution therefor of the following:—

“18. Any articulated vehicle used in the haulage of any goods, merchandise, machinery or building material of any kind or description whatsoever —

(i) for trade —

(a) in Georgetown or New Amsterdam \$120.00

(b) between Georgetown and Rosignol or Vreed-en-Hoop and Parika —

(1) not exceeding 5 tons payload 300.00

(2) exceeding 5 tons payload 500.00

(c) elsewhere in the Colony 180.00

(ii) for hire —

(a) in Georgetown and New Amsterdam 200.00

(b) between Georgetown and Rosignol or Vreed-en-Hoop and Parika — . .

(1) not exceeding 5 tons payload 500.00

(2) exceeding 5 tons payload 700.00

(c) elsewhere in the Colony 200.00

(b) by the revocation of proviso (a).”
