

BRITISH GUIANA

ORDER

MADE UNDER

THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE,

(Chapter 309).

UNDER SECTION 8 OF THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR AS FOLLOWS :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs (Amendment) Order, 1965.

2. Part I of the first schedule to the Customs Ordinance as amended from time to time is hereby further amended by the insertion after item 075-02.5 of the following new item —

“075-02.6 Curry powder and

mixed spices . . Lb. 04 — — 30% 50%”.

3. Part III of the first schedule to the Customs Ordinance as amended from time to time is hereby further amended by the addition of the following item —

“70. Coriander seeds, tumeric, and white cumin seeds for use in the manufacture of curry powder.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This is not a part of the order but is intended to indicate its general purport).

This Order seeks to impose import duty on curry powder or such mixed spices that would be regarded essentially as curry powder and to re-enact the provisions of order No. 50 of 1964 which expired on 13th November, 1964.
