"PROCLAMATION

GUYANA Sead No. 6 of 1986 No. 2 of 1986

By the President of the Co-operative Republic of Guyana

H.D. Hoyte, President

WHEREAS by Proclamation dated 30th October, 1985, issued under article 70(2) of the Constitution, the Fourth Parliament of Guyana was dissolved on 31st October, 1985;

AND WHEREAS it is provided by article 69(1) of the Constitution that each session of Parliament shall be held at such place within Guyana and shall begin at such time, not being later than four months from the end of the preceding session if Parliament has been dissolved, as the President shall appoint by proclamation:q

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of article 69(1) of the Constitution, I do hereby appoint the Parliament Chamber, Public Buildings, Georgetown, Guyana, as the place where a session of the Fifth Parliament shall be held as aforesaid and 2 o'clock in the afternoon on 3rd day of February, 1986, as the time when such session shall begin.

Given under my hand and the Seal of Guyana, at the Office of the Prediden-Georgetown, Guyana, this 7th day of January, 1986, and in the sixteenth year of the Republic.

The Speaker: Comrades and hon. Members, now that we are properly and fully qualified, we can proceed with our other business on the Order Paper, which we will begin with Prayers.

Grant us, O God, Thine aid and guidance, so that we may deal justly with the several causes that come before us, laying aside all private interests, prejudices and personal preferences, so that the result of our counsels may be to the glory of Thy Blessed Name, the maintenance of true religion, the preservation of justice, the safety, honour and happiness of the President and the peace and prosperity of Guyana.

Grant us, O God, the vision so to lead, that all the people of this fair land may enter into that state of brotherhood and unity, where the mind is led forward by Thee into everwidening thought and action."

REMARKS BY THE SPEAKER

The Speaker: Comrades and hon. Hembers, before we proceed with the further business on the Order Paper, I would like to take advantage of this first opportunity to extend to you my most sincere thanks for electing me to preside over theseproceedings. It is indeed a very great honour which you have continued to confer upon me. My grateful thanks I also give to the proposer and seconder of my nomination.

When the Members of the last National Assembly met in the Supreme Congress on the 30th of October, 1985, we were informed by the President that Parliament would be dissolved on the following day and that the general and regional elections would be held on the 9th December, 1985. Those of us who were there at the time not only bade farewell to each other, but we extended good wishes for success in returning.

Following the results of the elections, 31 of the former Members have not been successful in coming back and we have 32 new Members. Iwould like to place on record my thanks to the last Assembly for the assistance and co-operation given to me. I also extend best wishes to those who have failed to return. I would like to pay aspecial tribute to my Deputy in the last Parliament who is no other than

Cde. Ram Karran. As we may all know, Cde. Ram Karran first became a Parliamentarian in 1953, that is just over 32 years ago. He has given long and dedicated Parliamentary service and I know that we will all miss him. We wish him good health in his retirement.

I am happy to see 40 of the former Members here again with us and I welcome them back. I also extend a special welcome to the 32 new Members among whom is one who first became and served as a Parliamentarian during 1953 and who has nowreturned again to Parliament. We welcome him back too.

I extend congratulations to all of you upon your becoming Members of the National Assembly. I also wish to congratulate Cde. Reepu Daman Persaud on his election as Deputy Speaker of the National Assembly.

This is the fourth time that I have been elected to be the Speaker of the National Assembly and my service in the Chair to date spans a period of 15 years. The experience which I have gained during these years has served me in good stead and has enabled me to note the many problemmatical areas in our proceedings and in our procedures. This experience will also enable me to serve you better.

I agree that there is need for improvement in certain areas. We have made a beginning with the Chamber and the adjoining rooms themselves. There have been general repairs, refurbishing, and re-painting and these have been from the roof, to the ceiling, to the floor. The slate on the badly leaking roof has been removed and replaced with zinc. The ceiling has been repaired and re-painted. The walls have all been cleaned and polished or painted. All the furniture here have been cleaned and re-polished. Accommodation for the Minority Members has been increased and improved with the provision of new and longer tables. Yery much work to brighten our Chamber has been done since the dissolution of the last Parliament. I would like to record our thanks to the Government and also to the Prime Minister for arranging for the carrying out of the works. The Ministry of Works carried out the tasks but a great deal of the work was done by private contractors. I would therefore like to record my thanks to the Permanent Secretary and to the officials of the Ministry of Works for the great assistance which they gave. I would also like to thank the contractors and their various workers and also the Clerk, the Deputy Clerk, the Sergeant-at-Arms and the other staff of the

Parliament Office for their assistance and co-operation in the exercise.

Another area of concern is the manner in which Members of Parliament dress for attendance at Sittings of the National Assembly. It is felt that there is need for improvement and steps are already being taken in this respect.

The behaviour of Members during Sittings has been another area of concern.

Wembers must act with decorum and conduct themselves in a fitand proper manner.

At this point I would like toquote the relevant Standing Order which states that a Member present in the Assembly during a debate -

- (a) shall enter or leave the Assembly with decorum;
- (b) shall not read books, newspapers, letters orother documents save such as relate to the business before the Assembly;
- (c) shall maintain silence while another Member is speaking, and shall not interrupt, except in accordance with these Standing Orders; and
- (d) shall otherwise conduct himself in a fit and proper manner.

It is my hope that this Assembly would function more efficiently and more effectively.

There are a few matters to which I would specially like to refer. These deal with the suspension of the Standing Orders, motions for the adjournment of the Assembly, the disposal of motions and questions submitted, and the contents of speeches. While provision exists for the suspension of the Standing Orders, these, in my opinion should be suspended only when absolutely necessary.

Matters which Members seek to discuss on motions for the adjournment of the Assembly must properly qualify for such discussion. They must be definite, they must be urgent and they must be of public importance and it is the Speaker who has been given the responsibility under the Standing Orders of being satisfied that matters qualify for discussion. If a matter does not qualify, the Speaker has no alternative but to refuse the claim.

Motions and questions submitted for debate and answers, respectively, have too often not been dealt with. The Speaker, according to our long established practice dating back to the fifties and the sixties, does not have the authority to place motions and questions on the Order Paper. This has always been the

responsibility of the Government. It is my hope that in this new Assembly motions and questions would be dealt with and disposed of.

On the question of the contents of speeches, Members must remember that they are required to confine their observations to the subject under discussion andthat their remarks must be relevant to the matter and that repetition either of their own or of other Members remarks is out of order and cannot be allowed.

Certain sections of the media seem to take great pride in attempting to say the Speaker disallows Members from speaking. Under Standing Order 32, Rule 9, it is stated that no Member shall be allowed to speak for more than thirty minutes. The rules so provide and that is what the Speaker enforces. It is my earnest hope that in this new Parliament we will work together in co-operation and that whatever bills or resolutions we pass would be for the betterment of the people of Guyana.

Comrades and hon. Nembers, I seek your co-operation in the performance of my duties and once again I thank you for eeelecting me to be the Speaker of the National Assembly. Applause
