GUYANA RICE BOARD (AMENDMENT) BILL 1973 - Bill No. 20/1973 published 11.10.73

ITEM 1 MISCELLANEOUS ENACTMENTS (AMENDMENT) BILL 1973 - Bill No. 19/1973 published 19.9.73

The Schedule was passed as printed.

Assembly resumed.

On a motion by the Minister of Finance, the Bill was read the third time and \underline{passed} as $\underline{amended}$ in Committee.
