MOTIONSSUSPENSION OF STANDING ORDER NO. 23

With the Leave of the Speaker, a motion by the Prime Minister to suspend Standing Order No. 23(3) to enable the Assembly to proceed with a motion on the death of Cde. J.N. Aaron, was put and carried.

CONDOLLENCE ON THE DEATH OF CDE. J.N. AARON

The Prime Minister moved the following motion which was seconded by the Leader of the Opposition:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly records its deep regret at the death of Cde. Joseph Nathaniel Aaron, Member of Parliament, and pays tribute to the service which he rendered and directs that an expression of its sympathy be conveyed to his sorrowing widow, children and other relatives.

After the Speaker associated himself with the tributes paid, the motion was put and carried with Members standing.

ELECTION OF THE PRESIDENT

As determined by the President under article 30(5) of the Constitution, by the President (Date of Election) Order, 1976 (No. 12), made on 12th February, and published in the Gazette on 14th February, 1976, the meeting of the National Assembly was held for the purpose of electing the President of Guyana.

Cde. Arthur Chung was nominated in accordance with article 30(6) of the Constitution on 21st February, 1976, for re-election as President.

In accordance with article 30(4) of the Constitution a secret ballot was taken for election to the Office of President.

The number of votes received by the Candidate was thirty-seven (37).

Cde. Arthur Chung, having received the votes of more than half of all the elected Members of the Assembly, was declared by the Speaker to be elected President of Guyana in accordance with article 30(8) of the Constitution.

SUSPENSION OF SITTING

At 2.32 p.m. the sitting was suspended.

RESUMPTION OF SITTING

At 2.52 p.m. the sitting was resumed.

OATH OF PRESIDENT

Their Excellencies, the President, Cde. Arthur Chung, and his wife, Cde. Doreen Chung, were received in the Chamber, and in accordance with article 32 A. (1) of the Constitution, the oath of Office was administered by the Chancellor, Cde. J.O.F. Haynes, to and was made and subscribed by the President.

CONGRATULATIONS TO THE PRESIDENT

The President was congratulated by

- (i) the Speaker,
- (ii) the Prime Minister, and
- (iii) the Leader of the Opposition.

REPLY BY THE PRESIDENT

Thereafter, the President, Cde. Arthur Chung, replied to the congratulatory speeches.

Their Excellencies then withdrew from the Chamber.

ADJOURNMENT

At 3.25 p.m., on a motion by the Minister of Parliamentary Affairs and Leader of the House, the Assembly was adjourned to 2.00 p.m. on Thursday, 18th March, 1976.
