## ITEM 1 MOTION TO APPROVE FINANCIAL PAPER NO. 1/1973

## In Committee of Supply

In accordance with article 80(2) of the Constitution, the Minister of Finance and Trade signified Cabinet's recommendation and moved the following motion:

#### BE IT RESOLVED:

That the Committee of Supply approve of the proposals set out in Financial Paper No. 1/1973 - Schedule of Supplementary Provision - Uncovered Advances from the Contingencies Fund in 1972, totalling \$1,818,958.

The Schedule to the Financial Paper was under consideration when the time for the suspension of the sitting was reached.

# ITEM 3 - MOTION TO CONFIRM CUSTOMS DUTIES DRDERS (NOS. 3 AND 9 OF 1973)

In accordance with article 80(2) of the Constitution, the Minister of Finance and Trade signified Cabinet's recommendation and moved the following motion:

WHEREAS Government has decided to increase the export levy on shrimp exported from Guyana and at the same time to formalise the concessions to trawler owners operating out of Guyana;

AND WHEREAS in pursuance of the said decision the Minister of Finance and Trade, on the 18th of January, 1973, made the Customs Duties (Amendment) Order 1973 (No. 3), in terms of section 8 of the Customs Ordinance, Chapter 309, which was published in the Official Gazette of Saturday, the 20th of January, 1973;

AND WHEREAS in the said Order paragraph "45" which was intended to be referred to therein was inadvertently referred to as paragraph "40";

AND WHEREAS the Minister of Finance and Trade, on the 26th of January, 1973, made the Customs Duties (Amendment) (No. 2) Order 1973 (No. 9), in terms of section 8 of the Customs Ordinance, Chapter 309, which was published in the Official Gazette of Saturday, the 27th of January, 1973, correcting the said inadvertence referred to:

#### BE IT RESULVED:

That this National Assembly, in terms of section 9 of the Customs Ordinance, Chapter 309, confirm both Orders Now. 3 and 9 of 1973.

Mr. Ram Karran, Mrs. DaSilva and the Leader of the Opposition spoke to the motion.

Thereafter the Minister of Finance and Trade replied.

The motion was then put and carried.

## BILL - Second and Third Readings

ASSEMBLIES OF GOD (INCORPORATION) (AMENDMENT) BILL 1973 -ITEM 4 Bill No. 1/1973 published in the Gazette and in the Daily Chronicle newspaper of 20.1.73, 27.1.73 and 3.2.73

On motions by Mr. Bissember, seconded by Miss Ackman, the PRIVATE BILL intituled AN ACT TO AMEND THE ASSEMBLIES OF GOD (INCORPORATION) URDINANCE, 1958 was read a second time and was thereafter taken through its remaining stages and passed as printed.
