REQUESTS FOR LEAVE TO MOVE THE ADJOURNMENT OF THE ASSEMBLY ON DEFINITE MATTERS OF URGENT PUBLIC IMPORTANCE

The Leader of the Opposition sought leave to move the adjournment of the Assembly for the purpose of discussing matters concerning hooliganism at public meetings.

His Honour the Speaker did not allow the claim as he was not satisfied that the matter qualified as one to be raised on a motion for the adjournment of the Assembly.

PUBLIC BUSINESS

MUTION

MOTION ON THE GEORGETOWN ACCORD

Assembly resumed the debate on the following motion:

WHEREAS the Agreement establishing the Caribbean Free Trade Association with effect from 1 May, 1968, envisaged the ultimate creation of a viable economic community of the Commonwealth Caribbean Countries;

AND WHEREAS over the past five years the Caribbean Free Trade Association and programmes of functional co-operation between Member States have laid the foundation for further progress in regional economic integration;

AND WHEREAS the hopes and aspirations of the peoples of the Commonwealth Caribbean for balanced development, full employment and improved standards of living can most rapidly be attained -

- (i) by the optimum utilization of the available human and natural resources of the area,
- (ii) by accelerated, coordinated and sustained economic development, and
- (iii) by effective functional cooperation between Commonwealth Caribbean Countries through regional institutions, services and programmes designed to enhance the economic, social and cultural development of the area;

AND WHEREAS for the achievement of these objectives the Eighth Conference of Heads of Government of Commonwealth Caribbean Countries meeting in Guyana reached agreement on certain measures set out in the Georgetown Accord:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly -

- (1) Welcomes the measures agreed upon by the Eighth Conference of Heads of Government of Commonwealth Caribbean Countries as set out in the Georgetown Accord.
- (2) Approves of Guyana participating in the Caribbean Community, including the Caribbean Common Market, and in the related mechanisms and arrangements for the economic, social and cultural development of the Commonwealth Caribbean Region as set out in that Accord.

Mr. Chandisingh resumed his speech and moved the following amendment to the motion:

<u>Deletion</u> of paragraphs (1) and (2) of the Resolve Clause and <u>substitution</u> of the following therefor:

Refers the question of Guyana's participation in the Caribbean Community, including the Caribbean Common Market and the related mechanisms and arrangements for the Commonwealth Caribbean Region as set out in the Accord to the vote of the electors qualified to vote in an election.

Mr. Reepu Daman Persaud seconded the amendment but reserved the right to speak later.

Mr. Lall, Mr. Balchand Persaud and Mr. Reepu Daman Persaud spoke to the motion.

SUSPENSION OF SITTING

At 3.57 p.m. the sitting was suspended for refreshments.

At 4.27 p.m. the sitting was resumed.
