BILL - Second Reading

- NATIONAL INSURANCE AND SOCIAL SECURITY BILL, 1969 - Bill No. 15/1969 published 10. 7. 69

Assembly resumed the debate on the motion for the second reading of the following Bill:

A BILL intituled AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A SYSTEM OF NATIONAL INSURANCE AND SOCIAL SECURITY PROVIDING PECUNIARY PAYMENTS BY WAY OF OLD AGE BENEFIT, INVALIDITY BENEFIT, SURVIVOR'S BENEFIT, SICKNESS BENEFIT, MATERNITY BENEFIT AND FUNERAL BENEFIT, AND TO SUBSTITUTE FOR COMPENSATION UNDER THE WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ORDINANCE A SYSTEM OF INSURANCE AGAINST INJURY OR DEATH CAUSED BY ACCIDENT ARISING OUT OF AND IN THE COURSE OF EMPLOYMENT OR RESULTING FROM DISEASE DUE TO THE NATURE OF EMPLOYMENT; TO ESTABLISH A NATIONAL INSURANCE FUND; AND TO PROVIDE FOR MATTERS CONNECTED WITH OR INCIDENTAL THERETO.

Clauses 3 to 10 were passed as printed.

Clause 11:

Mr. Jagan moved the following amendment:

Substitution of the words "fifty-five" for the words "sixty-five" in paragraph (a) of subsection (1).
