#### ORAL ASKING AND ANSWERING OF QUESTIONS

## Question No. 17

Mr. Bowman asked the Minister of Communications and Works the following question:

Will the Honourable Minister of Communications and Works state whether the Demerara Electric Company, Limited was requested by Government at any time to put all overhead street wiring underground, and the Company refused on the ground that such an undertaking would cost about sixteen million dollars or twice their capital investment?

The Minister of Communications and Works gave the following reply:

ANSWER: In accordance with the provisions of Section 4 of the Georgetown Electric Supply and Tramways Ordinance, Chapter 79 (Chapter 238, Laws of British Guiana, 1953, Vol. IV), the Government by letter dated 12th May, 1954, required the Company to place its distributing mains and service lines in the urban area of Greater Georgetown, underground. The Company in a letter dated 6th April, 1955, refused to comply with this requirement contending that it is not reasonable within the meaning of the Section of the Law under which the requirement was made.
