ANNOUNCEMENTS BY THE SPEAKER

(i) Death of Dr. Desrey Fox, Minister in the Ministry of Education

The Speaker informed Members of the tragic death of Dr. Desrey Clementine Caesar Fox, a Minister of the Government.

The Speaker stated Dr. Fox was declared a Member of the National Assembly of the Ninth Parliament of Guyana with effect from 13th September, 2006, following the General and Regional Elections which were held on Monday, 28th August, 2006.

Dr. Fox was appointed Minister in the Ministry of Education on 9th September, 2006, and held that position until her death on 11th December, 2009.

(ii) Death of Mr. Brindley Horatio Benn

The Speaker also announced the passing of Mr. Brindley Horatio Benn on 11th December, 2009, after a brief illness.

Mr. Benn first became a Legislator on the 5th September, 1957 and ceased to be a Member on the 5th November, 1968. During that period Mr. Benn held the post of Deputy Prime Minister, Minister of Education and Minister of Agriculture.

Following the General and Regional Elections on 5th October, 1992, the Elections Commission declared Mr. Benn on the 24th November, 1992, to have become and he again became a Member of the National Assembly from that date.

On the 7th July, 1993, Mr. Benn resigned his seat as a Member of the National Assembly, consequent upon his appointment as High Commissioner to Canada, a position he held from 1993 to 1998.

The last public offices he held were Chairman of the Public Service Commission, Chairman of the Guyana Lotteries Commission and a Member of the Appeals Board of the Guyana Revenue Authority.

(iii) Death of Mr. Nasir Ally, Former Member of Parliament

The Speaker stated that it was with deep regret that he had learnt of the passing of Mr. Nasir Ally, a former Member of Parliament.

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Following the General and Regional Elections on 19th March, 2001, Mr. Ally was declared by the Elections Commission to become an elected Member of the National Assembly on 17th April, 2001, of the Eighth Parliament of Guyana.

Mr. Ally served as a Member of Parliament until the Parliament was dissolved on 2nd May, 2006.

Thereafter, the Speaker and Members of the Assembly stood and observed one minute's silence as a mark of respect for the late Dr. Desrey Clementine Caesar Fox, Mr. Brindley Horatio Benn and Mr. Nasir Ally.

MOTION

ITEM 1 GUYANA'S MODEL OF A LOW CARBON DEVELOPMENT PATH

The Minister of Agriculture, on behalf of the Prime Minister and Minister of Public Works and Communications, moved the following motion:

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WHEREAS international acceptance of scientific evidence that high concentrations of carbon dioxide in the atmosphere are rising exponentially, leading to alarming levels of global warming and related sea level rise is no longer a matter of dispute;

AND WHEREAS the causes of these phenomena are also now accepted at all international fora and thus the time as no other is for global concerted action to reverse these dangerous and planet and life threatening phenonmena;

AND WHEREAS the 54 Commonwealth Heads of Government arrived at the Port of Spain Consensus and Declaration on Climate Change which it is taking to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change Conference of Parties in Copenhagen 2009 in order to further the efforts to reach an agreement that will require commitments to deep cut in emissions by the main contributors to carbon emissions and financial and technical support to the most vulnerable nations in the world in the interim;

AND WHEREAS Guyana's Low Carbon development Strategy demonstrates how rainforest countries can use their rainforest to mitigate Climate Change and at the same time use it as the basis for a financial flow to finance a low carbon development path, with adaptation, mitigation and technology transfer as key elements;

AND WHEREAS Guyana's innovative low carbon development path was scrutinized through a consultative process which involved more than 144 communities, particularly in Amerindian communities as well as representatives of various sector groups including forestry, mining, women, youth, academic, and labour;

AND WHEREAS this process was managed and coordinated by a broad-based multi-sectoral steering committee comprising representatives of the National Toushaos' Council, Amerindian NGOs, forestry and mining groups, the private sector, organised labour, and international monitors under the chairmanship of His Excellency the President;

AND WHEREAS the international community has applauded Guyana for its consultation process and efforts to pursue a low carbon development pathway with examples being the World Bank Forest Carbon Partnership Facility and the unique Memorandum of Understanding with the Government of Norway;

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this National Assembly:

- 1. Recognises the efforts to build national consensus and mobilize the international community support for Climate Change and Guyana's model of a Low Carbon Development Pathway;
- 2. Supports Guyana's model of a Low carbon development pathway tabled in the House as the revised Low Carbon Development Strategy;
- Endorses Guyana's commitment to a new agreement at the upcoming UNFCCC Conference of the Parties in Copenhagen, December 2009 which will bind countries to carbon reductions and release financial support to mitigate the repercussions of climate change on vulnerable countries; and
- 4. Lends unequivocal support to the Guyana delegation at the UNFCC Conference in struggling/lobbying for a post 2012 agreement on Climate Change in the interest of the world and Guyana.
