The Speaker informed Members that since the last sitting, Cde. Abel Dorrick, who had been **the Me**mber elected to the Assembly by the Regional Democratic Council for Region 9 - Upper Takutu/Upper Essequibo, had died.

#### (c) Cde. Wellesley Trevelyan Lord

The Speaker said that two persons who had served previously as legislators had died. They were Cde. Percival Augustus Cummings and Cde. Wellesley Trevelyan Lord.

Cde. Cummings had been one of the Governor's nominees to the Upper House, i.e., the State Council, of the 1953 Legislature, where he served from 26th May, 1953, and up to the time of the suspension of the Constitution in December, 1953. He had also been nominated to the Interim Legislative Council which followed, and served there from December, 1953 to September, 1957. During that time he had been assigned responsibility for Labour, Health and Housing.

Cde. Lord had been a nominated Member of the Interim Legislative Council and served there from January, 1954 to June, 1957.

Both persons had made their respective contributions in the Legislature.

The Speaker said that he was sure that Members of the Assembly would wish to record their regret at the passing of the two persons and to extend their sympathy to their bereaved families. He therefore requested the Clerk to convey their condolences accordingly.
