

NOTICE

INTERPRETATION ORDINANCE,

(Chapter 5).

UNDER SECTION 39 OF THE INTERPRETATION ORDINANCE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR DELEGATED WITH EFFECT FROM THE 16TH MAY, 1965 THE POWERS SPECIFIED IN THE FIRST COLUMN OF THE SCHEDULE HEREUNDER CONFERRED ON THE GOVERNOR BY THE ORDINANCES MENTIONED IN THE SECOND COLUMN OF THE SAID SCHEDULE TO THE PERSON MENTIONED IN THE THIRD COLUMN THEREOF, SUBJECT HOWEVER TO THE FOLLOWING QUALIFICATION:—

That the delegation of powers mentioned herein shall remain in force only until varied or revoked by the Governor.

2. The delegation of the powers mentioned herein to the Minister of Trade and Industry on the 3rd day of February, 1962, is revoked.

To approve of the issue of a licence by the Commissioner of Lands and Mines authorising anyone named in the licence to occupy any portion of the unoccupied crown lands of the Colony for the purposes of mining subject to the provisions of the Mining Ordinance, Chapter 196, and the Mining Regulations. 2. To approve of the transfer of a licence by the holder thereof to any other person and the creation in any licence by the holder thereof of a right, title or interest, legal or equitable in favour of any other person. 3. To authorise the forfeiture of all gold, silver, valuable minerals, precious stones, metals, minerals, mineral oil, asphalt, coal or other substances of a like nature which may have been seized by any officer for being removed, conveyed, purchased or otherwise dealt with contrary to the Mining Ordinance or the Mining Regulations, to which no claim is made or sustained within six months from the date of the seizure. 4. To authorise the export of precious stones other than through a bank.	The Mining Regulations, Chapter 196. (Regulation 201).	The Minister of Forests, Lands and Mines.
5. To authorise persons other than wholesale dealers to import explosives into the Colony.	The Explosives Ordinance, Chapter 346. (Section 10(1)).	The Minister of Forests, Lands and Mines.
