

NOTICE**THE INTERPRETATION ORDINANCE**
(Chapter 5)

UNDER SECTION 39 OF THE INTERPRETATION ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 5, THE POWERS SPECIFIED IN THE FIRST COLUMN CONFERRED BY THE ORDINANCE MENTIONED IN THE SECOND COLUMN HAVE BEEN DELEGATED BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR TO THE OFFICER MENTIONED IN THE THIRD COLUMN.

1. To appoint from time to time revising officers to sit at suitable places within any county for the purpose of revising the list of jurors for the county and of revising the list of jurors transmitted by the Registrar under section 27 of the Criminal Law (Procedure) Ordinance, Chapter 11.	The Criminal Law (Procedure) Ordinance, Chapter 11 (section 25 (1))	The Chief Justice.
2. To appoint magistrates to be members of Boards which may grant licences to use premises for exhibitions in which inflammable or non-inflammable films are used.	The Cinematograph Ordinance, Chapter 127 (section 11 (2) and (20)).	The Chief Justice.
3. To appoint magistrates to be members of the District Licensing Boards for Demerara, Berbice and Essequibo for any period he may think fit and to revoke any such appointment.	The Intoxicating Liquor Licensing Ordinance, Chapter 316 (Section 6 (2), (3), (4) and (6)).	The Chief Justice.
4. To appoint, in the event of a member of a District Licensing Board being disqualified or absent or unable to act, another magistrate to be a member of that Board for a specific occasion, or for such limited time as he may think fit or generally and to revoke any such appointment.	The Intoxicating Liquor Licensing Ordinance, Chapter 316 (section 6 (5) and (6)).	The Chief Justice.
5. To appoint a member of a District Licensing Board to be chairman of that Board.	The Intoxicating Liquor Licensing Ordinance, Chapter 316. (section 6 (7)).	The Chief Justice.
