

NOTICE
INTERPRETATION ORDINANCE,
 (Chapter 5).

UNDER SECTION 39 OF THE INTERPRETATION ORDINANCE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH (1) OF ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR ON THE 3RD DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1962, DEPUTED THE MINISTER OF TRADE AND INDUSTRY TO EXERCISE ON HIS BEHALF THE POWERS SPECIFIED IN THE FIRST COLUMN OF THE SCHEDULE TO THIS NOTICE CONFERRED ON THE GOVERNOR BY THE ENACTMENTS MENTIONED IN THE SECOND COLUMN OF THE SAID SCHEDULE SUBJECT HOWEVER TO THE FOLLOWING QUALIFICATION:—

That the delegation of powers mentioned herein shall remain in force only until varied or revoked by the Governor.

SCHEDULE

Powers Delegated	Enactment
1. To approve of the issue of a licence by the Commissioner of Lands and Mines authorising anyone named in the licence to occupy any portion of the unoccupied crown lands of the Colony for the purposes of mining subject to the provisions of the Mining Ordinance, Chapter 196, and of the Mining Regulations.	The Mining Ordinance, Chapter 196. (Section 32(1)).
2. To approve of the transfer of a licence by the holder thereof to any other person and the creation in any licence by the holder thereof of a right, title or interest, legal or equitable in favour of any other person.	The Mining Ordinance, Chapter 196. (Section 35(4)).
3. To authorise the forfeiture of all gold, silver, valuable minerals, precious stones, metals, minerals, mineral oil, asphalt, coal or other substances of a like nature which may have been seized by any officer for being removed, conveyed, purchased or otherwise dealt with contrary to the Mining Ordinance or the Mining Regulations, to which no claim is made or sustained within six months from date of the seizure.	The Mining Ordinance, Chapter 196. (Section 86(3)).
4. To authorise the export of precious stones other than through a bank.	The Mining Regulations, Chapter 196. (Regulation 201).
5. To authorise persons other than wholesale dealers to import explosives within the Colony.	The Explosives Ordinance, Chapter 346. (Section 10(1)).
