AND WHEREAS it is necessary that the outstanding Reports should be completed and submitted early to the Assembly:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That the National Assembly authorises the Public Accounts Committee of the present Session of Parliament to examine and use the records and the evidence taken, in respect of the examination, by previous Public Accounts Committees, of the Public Accounts and of the Accounts of the Transport and Harbours Department for the years 1962 to 1966, which have not yet been reported on to the National Assembly, so as to facilitate the present Committee in its early completion and submission to the National Assembly of the outstanding Reports.

- (i) Will the Minister say whether he is aware that owing to the inadequate fence in the rear of Black Bush Polder, cattle get into it and damage the settlers' rice and provision crops?
- (ii) Will the Minister say whether steps will be taken to prevent cattle from entering the Polder?
- (iii) Will the Minister say, further, whether it is Government's intention to compensate settlers who have suffered loss through damage to their crops by cattle?
