2. The Financial Secretary to move the following motion:-

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this Council in terms of section 9 of the Customs Ordinance, Chapter 309, confirms Order in Council No. 71 of 1958, which was made on the 24th day of November, 1958, and published in the Gazette on the 6th of December, 1958.

3. The Financial Secretary to move the following motion:-

BE IT RESOLVED:

That pending the passing of the 1959 Estimates, this Council approves of such expenditure for Recurrent and Development Expenditure in 1959 as may be required for the maintenance of existing services and the continuance of works in progress on the basis approved by this Council in the Annual and Supplementary Estimates for the year 1958.

4. The Minister of Labour, Health and Housing to move the following motion:-

WHEREAS the Medical Practitioners (Temporary Registration) Ordinance, Chapter 135, came into operation on the 26th July, 1947;

AND WHEREAS section 5 of the said Ordinance provides that the Ordinance shall continue in force, up to and including the 31st December, 1951, but that the Legislative Council may, prior to the expiration of the Ordinance, by resolution (which resolution shall be published in the Gazette) declare that the said Ordinance shall continue in force for a further period of one year from the date of that expiration and may from time to time, prior to the expiration of that or any further continued operation, similarly declare that it shall continue for a further period of one year;

AND WHEREAS by the Medical Practitioners (Temporary Registration) (Extension) Ordinance, 1954 (No. 6), the Medical Practitioners (Temporary Registration) Ordinance, Chapter 135, has been continued in force as though that Ordinance had been continued in force by resolution of the

Legislative Council in accordance with the provisions of section 5 thereof for the period commencing on the 1st January, 1956, and ending on 31st December, 1956;

AND WHEREAS the Legislative Council have thereafter from time to time in accordance with the provisions of section 5 aforesaid by resolution declared that the Medical Practitioners (Temporary Registration) Ordinance shall continue in force;

AND WHEREAS the said Ordinance is due to expire on the 31st December, 1958;

AND WHEREAS it is desirable that the said Ordinance should continue in operation for a further period;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Medical Practitioners (Temporary Registration) Ordinance, Chapter 139, shall continue in force for a further period of one year from the 1st January, 1959.

5. The Minister of Labour, Health and Housing to move the following motion:-

WHEREAS the Rent Restriction Ordinance, Chapter 186, came into operation on the 8th day of November, 1941;

AND WHEREAS section 33 of the said Ordinance, provides that the Ordinance shall continue in force up to and including the 31st day of December, 1951, but that, prior to the expiration thereof, the Legislative Council may, by Resolution published in the Gazette, declare that the said Ordinance shall continue in operation for a further period of one year;

AND WHEREAS the said Ordinance has been continued in operation until the 31st December, 1958;

AND WHEREAS it is considered expedient that the said Ordinance shall be continued in operation for a further period of one year:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Rent Restriction Ordinance, Chapter 186, shall continue in force for a further period of one year up to and including the 31st day of December, 1959.
