MOTIONS

5. Mr. Hugh to move the following motion:

WHEREAS there are a number of buildings in the City of Georgetown, and more particularly in the southern section, occupied by working class families, that are dilapidated and injurious to health;

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this Legislative Assembly recommends to Government that the Central Authority be requested to invoke the powers conferred on the Authority under Section 1 of the Housing Ordinance, Chapter 182, to ensure that buildings occupied by the working class are kept in a fit state of repair.

6. Mr. Jordan to move the following motion:

BE IT RESOLVED:

That this Legislative Assembly recommends to Government that the lands in the Wisnar/Christianburg district known as Half Mile, One Mile, Valley of Tears, Blueberry Hill, etc., be laid out in lots for sale at nominal cost and on easy long term payments to those persons known as "Squatters" who now occupy those lands;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:

That arrangements be made for the granting of loans to those persons whose homes may have to be removed consequent on the laying out of those areas.
