### **MOTION**

### 17. NON-LETHAL WEAPONS

Mr. Everall Franklin, M.P. to move the following motion:

WHEREAS the Members of the Guyana Police Force are equipped with weapons such as firearms in the form of handguns, shotguns, rifles and machine guns as well as batons;

AND WHEREAS in the execution of their duties they may have to use force to protect themselves, prevent the commission of a crime or protect property;

AND WHEREAS these weapons, in particular firearms, without exception are designed to inflict severe injury to a person or persons:

AND WHEREAS these injuries may often result in the unwanted death of the targeted person or persons due to the very nature of the weapon's design;

AND WHEREAS without the required training, capability, marksmanship and judgment of the user severe injury or death may be the result of such use;

AND WHEREAS the Members of the Guyana Police Force in executing their duty often have no alternative but to use the issued weapons and from time to time bemoan the fact that non-lethal weapons could have been used if available,

#### BE IT RESOLVED:

- (i) That hand to hand combat training be intensified and expanded within the Guyana Police Force;
- (ii) That a psychological evaluation of all ranks carrying firearms be conducted annually;
- (iii) That counseling be made mandatory for ranks who have used force resulting in death;
- (iv) That the Guyana Police Force design and conduct within six (6) months marksmanship training for all ranks authorized to use firearms; and

That non-lethal weapons such as pepper spray, tasers and non and less lethal (v) ammunition such as rubber projectiles be acquired and police ranks trained in their use.
