ORDER

MADE UNDER

THE PUBLIC AND JUDICIAL OFFICERS (REMUNERATION)
ORDINANCE, 1962.
(No. 26 of 1962).

UNDER SECTION 5 OF THE PUBLIC AND JUDICIAL OFFICERS (REMUNERATION) ORDINANCE, 1962, THE FOLLOWING ORDER HAS BEEN MADE BY THE MINISTER RESPONSIBLE FOR FINANCE:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Public and Judicial Officers (Remuneration) Order, 1966, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st January, 1965.

2. The schedule to the Public and Judicial Officers (Remuneration) Ordinance, 1962, is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of all the provisions relating to the Judges of the Supreme Court and the Director of Public Prosecutions, and the substitution therefor of the provisions contained in the schedule to this Order:

Provided that the person holding the office of judge of the Supreme Court or Director of Public Prosecutions at the date of the commencement of this Order may, within such time as may be agreed with the Minister responsible for finance, elect —

- (a) to be paid salary at the rate provided for his office immediately prior to the commencement of this Order; and
- (b) that the conditions relating to vacation leave which applied to him immediately prior to the commencement of this Order shall continue so to apply.

“Judges of the Supreme Court —

(a) The Chief Justice — Salary	\$15,600
(b) Every Puisne Judge — Salary	\$12,000
The Director of Public Prosecutions — Salary	\$12,000”
