THE SHOPS (CONSOLIDATION) ORDINANCE, 1958,
(No. 33 of 1958)

UNDER THE FIRST PROVISIO TO SUBSECTION (1) OF SECTION 3 OF THE SHOPS (CONSOLIDATION) ORDINANCE, 1958, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Shop Hours (Special Provision) (Rose Hall, Corentyne) Order, 1967.

2. Without prejudice to the other provisions of the Shops (Consolidation) Ordinance, 1958*, shops in the area described in the first schedule hereto are hereby permitted to open during the hours prescribed in the second schedule hereto.

FIRST SCHEDULE

(Area to which Order applies)

The village of Rose Hall situated on the east sea coast of the County of Berbice, bounded on the north by the Atlantic Ocean, on the south by Crown lands held by the proprietors of Plantation Albion, under Licence No. 2,719 on the east by Plantation Port Mourant, and on the west by Plantation Williamsburg.
