GUYANA

ORDER

MADE UNDER

THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE,

(Chapter 309).

UNDER SECTION 8 OF THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Duties (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1968.

2. The last paragraph of item 11 of Part III of the first schedule to the Customs Ordinance is hereby deleted and the following paragraph substituted therefor —

“Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this item —

- (i) prune wine and blending sherry when imported for use in the manufacture of rum in bonded premises; and
- (ii) malt whisky imported for use in the manufacture in Guyana of whisky consisting of imported spirit to an extent not exceeding thirty per centum in reference to the total proof gallons manufactured,

shall be exempt from import duty.”
